FINDS REEF IN MID-OCEAN

Captain Lawson of the Americana **Reports to Hydrographic Office.**

Reports to Hydrographic Office. Captain M. S. Lawson of the Ameri-can schooner Americana, from Kobe to Puget sound. reports that on March 5, 1909, a perfectly clear day, calm and smooth sea, he got excellent noon po-sition: latitude 29, 47 degrees north. Iongitude 142, 32 degrees east: sighted a reef about 800 feet long and 80 feet wide, laying nearly east and west, from six to eight feet of water on it and dis-tant from the vessel about three quar-ters of a mile, bearing N. N. E. (mag) from noon position. Upon reaching Cape Flattery, 31 days later, the chrono-meter was found to be corret. Captain Lawson has reported the mat-ter to the hydrographic office and John McNulty, nautical expert, in charge of the local branch, today sent out notices to mariners, acquainting them with the facts.
