Portland Union Stockyards, April 17.—The livestock situation was sold of new features today. Receipts for the day consisted of 107 head of cattle, 200 pigs or sheep.

Top steers are at over \$20.00 per head, but are very discriminating in their grading just now and are not allowing anything except select stuff to go under this high price.
