BARBUR'S RATE TO OPINION TO DRIVE

City Auditor Satisfied He Can Prove That Reinstatement and Breslauer Mutilated Excise Board Refers Petition.

No doubt exists in the mind of City Auditor Barbur of his ability to prove that M. Reinstatement and Samuel Breslauer were the ones who mutilated the excise board petition. Deputies in his office will swear positively that they checked over a large number of names on the petition and that they found no document in the vault the night before it was altered. These deputies will swear as to the contents of the petition, particularly regarding that part which they had checked up. As found the next morning many names in this petition had been erased and Barbur will be able to prove that this is the fact by reason of the check marks which were made on the signature sheets.

J. D. Potter is accused of attempting to bribe a juror in the Lee Young murder case. District Attorney Cameron said this afternoon that he would cause an indictment to be brought against the alleged briber by the grand jury early next week. Cameron said still others would be indicted but that was not at liberty to mention their names.

CLERK'S ERROR CAUSES SUIT

Shipper Insists on Paying Freight Rate Quoted by Mistake.

Because the railroad agent at Shallock gave him a lower rate on a shipment of 14,000 sheep to Rawlins, Wyo., than the railroad later compelled him to pay, J. G. Edwards, president of the Baldwin Sheep & Land company, is trying to compel the Columbia Southern railway and the O. R. & N. to refund him \$448, the excess over the rate that was quoted.
