

## ALASKAN COAST WELL MARKED

### Lighthouse Inspector Pond Undertakes Immense Project.

During the past few months Captain Charles F. Pond, United States lighthouse inspector of this district, which comprises Alaska, has devoted a great deal of attention to the Alaskan coast and Yukon river with the result that from now on the channels of the great waterways will be well marked. Through Captain Pond's recommendation \$50,000 has been appropriated for carrying out part of the immense undertaking.

Captain Pond has been promoted to command of an armored cruiser and will be relieved here next month by Commander J. M. Elliott and in winding up his affairs here has prepared the following list of aids along the coast and on the Yukon river. Those marked with a "P" have been recommended for installation with the funds now available, and the others have been recommended for installation as soon as an appropriation is made. It is the first complete list of these aids and will therefore be of much interest to navigators. It follows:

**Hog rocks.** acetylene beacon in place of present lens lantern; Spire island reef, acetylene beacon.

**Tongass Narrows.**—Idaho rock, acetylene buoy in place of present post lantern; Bar Point flat, second class buoy, red; West clump, seven-twelfths mile west northwest (mag.) from East clump, acetylene beacon; Lewis point, concrete beacon; Channel island, acetylene beacon.

**Nichols Passage.**—West Walcott rocks, acetylene beacon; Gull rock, Port Chester, acetylene beacon in place of present post lantern; Point McCarty, second class can buoy, black; Hild reef, second class nun buoy, red.

**Clarence Strait.**—Ship island, acetylene beacon; Round point, Zarembo island, acetylene beacon.

**Sumner Strait.**—Vichnefski rock, acetylene beacon; Eye Opener, acetylene beacon; Helm rock, second class can buoy, H. S.; Strait island, acetylene beacon; Calid rocks, acetylene beacon; southwest end Hamilton island, acetylene beacon; Shaskan strait, off rear 1/4 mile east from southwest end of Hamilton island, first class spar buoy, red; shoal north of Pontalene island, second class nun buoy, red; north end Spanish islands, acetylene beacon.

**Wrangell Narrows.**—Point Alexander, acetylene beacon; Point Lockwood rock, acetylene buoy; front range light opposite southeast Battery islets, acetylene beacon; rear range light opposite southeast Battery islets, acetylene beacon; Epile rock, concrete beacon; Burnt island ledge, acetylene beacon on present beacon; 300 yards northwest (mag.) above South ledge, acetylene beacon; Buah Top island, acetylene beacon on present beacon; Anchor Point, acetylene beacon; Boulder flat, acetylene buoy; Danger Point ledge, concrete beacon; 365 yards northwest by north (mag.) above Vexation point, acetylene beacon; South Green island, acetylene beacon on present beacon; south end Rock Point ledge, concrete beacon; south end South flat, acetylene beacon; Middle North flat, acetylene beacon; Green Point, first class spar buoy, red; ledge above Blunt Point, acetylene beacon; 3/4 mile south of Turn Point, first class spar buoy, black; opposite Turn Point above 500 feet south southwest, 3/4 west (mag.) from buoy 9, acetylene beacon; 1 1/2 fathoms shoal 1/4 mile east by south from Bayou Point, second class nun buoy, H. S.; 1 1/4 fathoms shoal 1/4 mile southeast 1/4 south from Bayou Point, first class spar buoy, red; Mitkof island, acetylene beacon 250 feet north northwest (mag.) from present post lantern light; Prolwewy rock, acetylene beacon to replace present post lantern light; north entrance Wrangell narrows, second class nun buoy, red.

**Frederick Sound.**—Northwest end Sukol islands, acetylene beacon; Yellows island, acetylene beacon; rock off Point Gardner, acetylene beacon; rock at entrance Murder cove, acetylene beacon; Stephens Passage—Eastern side Point Hugh, acetylene beacon; Midway islands, acetylene beacon; Grave Point, acetylene beacon; Point Arden, acetylene beacon; Point Young, acetylene beacon; Portland island, acetylene beacon.

**Lynn Canal.**—Battery point, acetylene beacon to replace present post lantern light.

**Chatham Strait.**—Rocky island, acetylene beacon; rock off Tenakee inlet, acetylene beacon.

**Icy Strait.**—Pleasant island reef, second class can buoy, black.

**Peril Strait.**—Otsol island, acetylene beacon; Rose island rock, acetylene beacon; Middle Point rock, acetylene beacon; Sorplus point, acetylene beacon; Channel islets, acetylene beacon; Wyvill reef, acetylene beacon; Whitstone narrows, acetylene buoy.

**Coast.**—Cape Spencer, first class light and fog signal; Ocean cape, first class light and fog signal; Cape St. Elias, first class light and fog signal; Rugged island, first class light and fog signal; Resurrection bay.

**Prince William Sound.**—Porpoise rocks, acetylene beacon; west end Buoy

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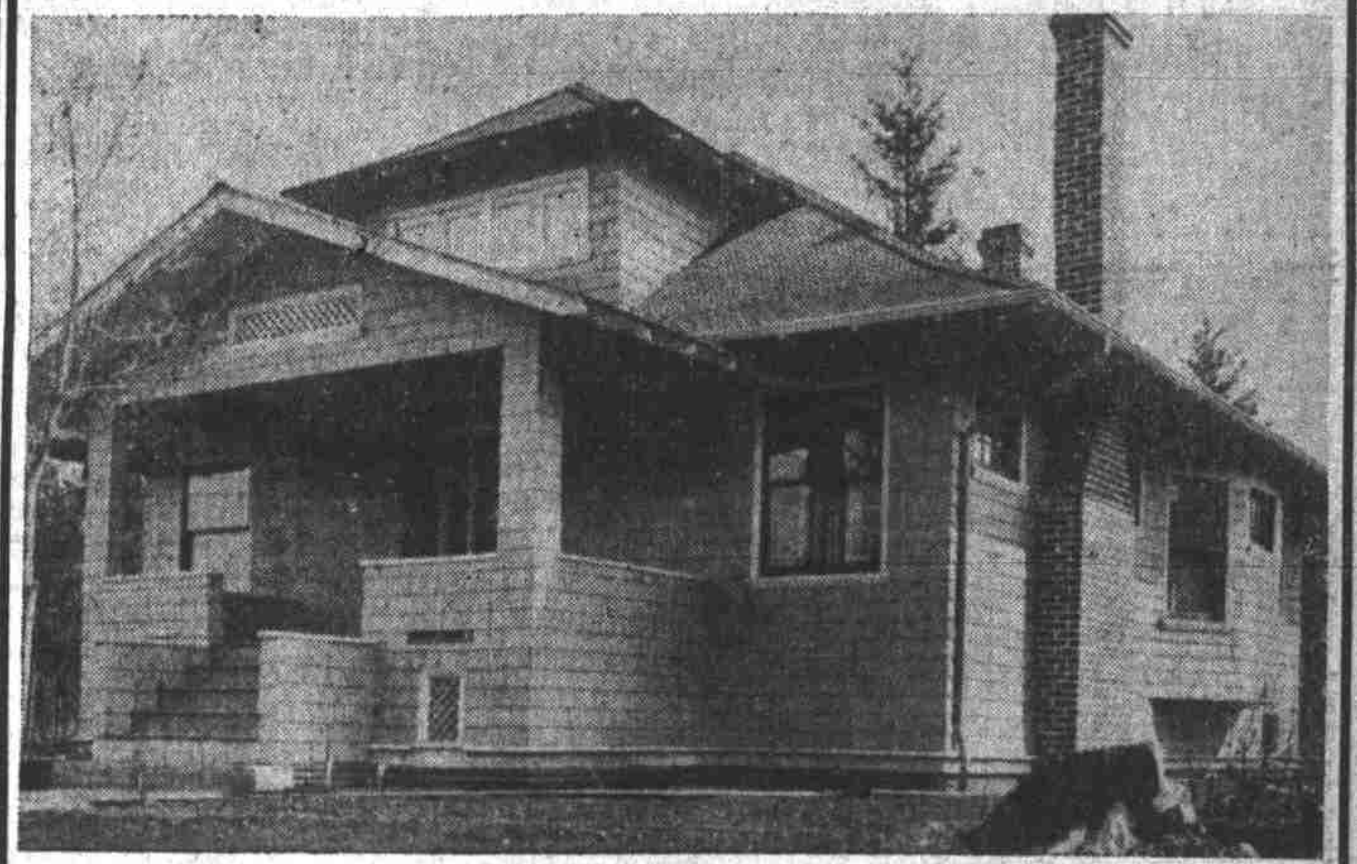
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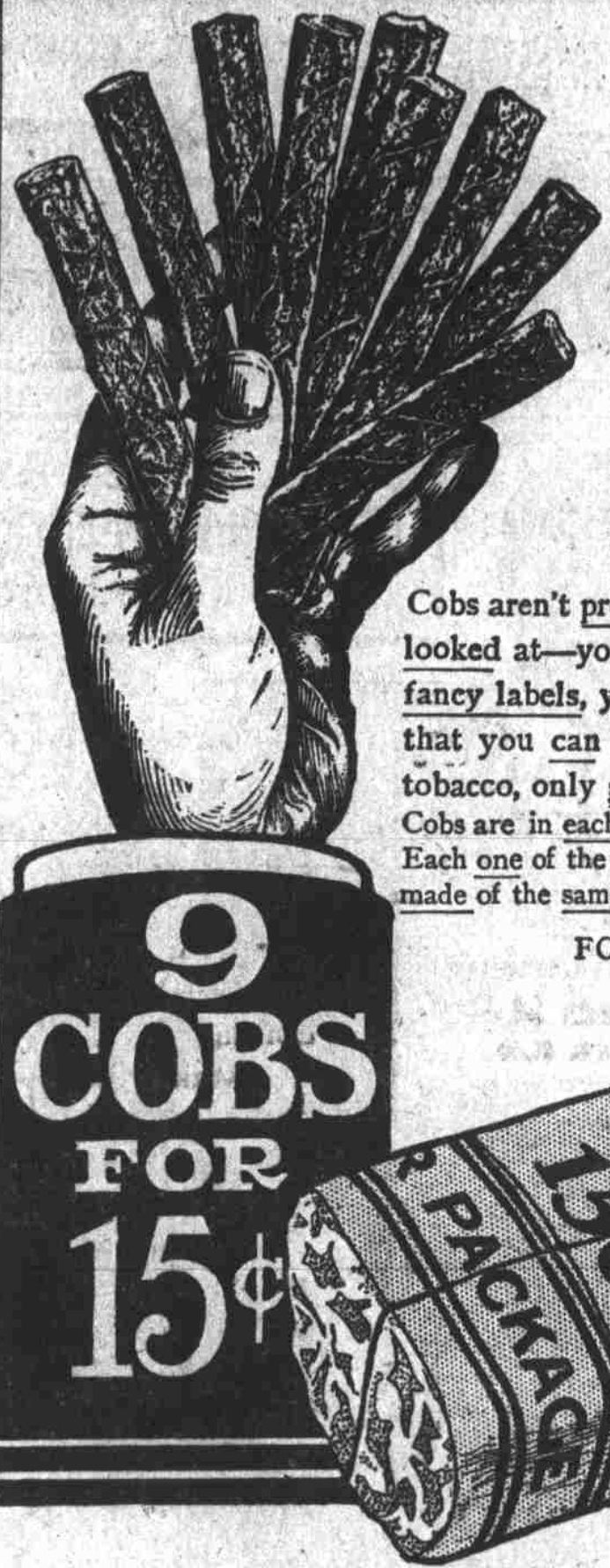
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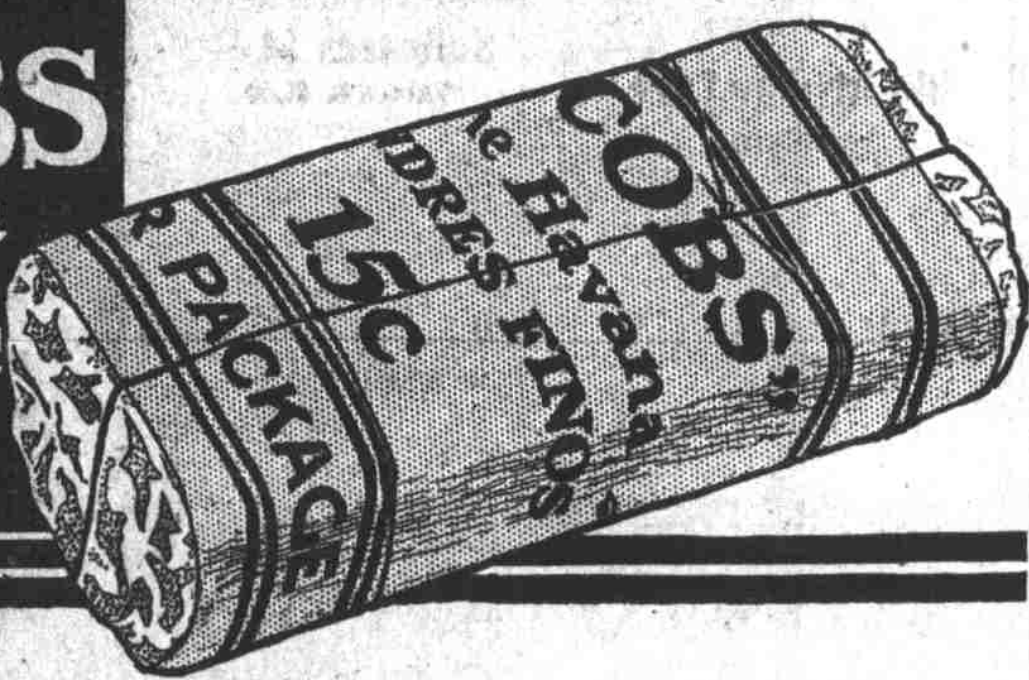
