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**COURT REWARDS
THE EARLY BIRD**

Appoints First Petitioner Administrator of George W. Morey's Estate.

Two would be administrators have appeared in the county court in the estate of George W. Morey, which is worth \$600 or \$700. One of the petitioners, William O. Elliott, beat the other by a neck yesterday and secured the appointment of A. B. Ferrera as administrator while Henry Westbrook, attorney for the other petitioner, was putting the final touches on his petition.

Both men were working without knowledge of the movements of the other, and appeared at the courthouse at almost the same time. Ferrera was a little ahead and was first to appear before Judge Webster, who granted letters on Ferrera's statement, as usual in such cases.

Had Westbrook appeared a few moments earlier he would likely have had the best of it, the petition he had prepared, asking for the appointment of John C. Jameson as administrator bore the written consent of the only heir, Mrs. John Jefferson of King Ferry, N. Y., to the appointment of Jameson, who is secretary of the general relief committee of the I. O. O. F. The Elliott petition states that the heirs are unknown to the petitioner, who is a creditor of the estate.

It is too small to provoke much controversy, and Westbrook is likely to forego his petition, since Ferrera already holds letters as administrator.
