FRISCO LAUGHS
AT BIG HOAX**"Wireless" Press Agent Delivers Clever One to Un-suspecting Newspapers.**

San Francisco, April 29.—This city is laughing over the clever press agent "stunt" of a wireless telegraph stock seller who put out a story of an "un-known woman" who for 30 years held a bunch of stock in the Bell Telephone company which she did not know was worth more than "a dollar or two" and which turned out to be "worth over a million dollars." The wireless agent approached the woman, so the story was told, with a view to selling her stock in the wireless corporation. The woman replied, "Never again. I was stung 30 years ago when I bought \$1500 worth of telephone stock and you cannot sell me anything."

"Where is your stock?" asked the wireless man.

"Get it; it is worth millions," said the wireless man.

The search followed. The stock was unearthed. "It is worth \$1,000,000."

PORTLAND NOW HAS IMPROVED WIRE SERVICE

Work was begun today at the local Western Union main office on the installation of Barclay system apparatus for the operation of a fast overland wire between Portland and San Francisco. The new system, which does away altogether with telegraph operators, allows the handling of several times the number of messages that could ordinarily be taken care of on a single wire. Tape, punched by hand to read as do the different messages, is fed into a machine at one end. An electric typewriter on the other end receives and writes out the messages.

The Barclay system, initiated by the general manager of the Western Union, is in operation in only four cities west of the Rocky mountains. Portland is the first city in the northwest in which one has been installed.

SELLING TICKETS FOR CHEAP SHOW**Boston Magnate's Wife Follows Her Chauffeur Down the Scale.**

San Francisco, Cal., April 29.—Local police and detectives from the Elms agency, Los Angeles and Boston, early this morning raided the rooms of a cheap lodging house in this city and arrested H. Keno, who has been conducting a moving picture show here, and a woman said to be Mrs. Nettie E. Shaw, wife of James F. Shaw, president of the Interborough railroads of Boston. The police took from the pair \$1000, the 11-year-old son of Shaw, whom the mother had brought west when she left the home of her husband in the fashionable Brookline district of Boston nearly two years ago.

Keno had been chauffeur for Shaw. They came first to Pasadena, where Mrs. Shaw, assuming the name of her former chauffeur, known also as Marlin, maintained a splendid home on Arroyo Drive. From Pasadena they came to Santa Barbara. Keno and Mrs. Shaw found employment at the La Petite theatre, a ten-cent picture show. The woman sold tickets, sitting day and night in the box office.

The police and detectives laid a careful plan, after having fully established their satisfaction the identity of the woman through Louis Field, a brother-in-law of Shaw's Brookline home, who was brought for the purpose by detectives in the employ of the husband. The boy was taken in charge by Chief of Police Nease and taken to the

chief's home. He said his name was Eldridge Shaw, although he had been called Eldridge Keno since coming west. Shaw is said to be one of the wealthiest business men of Boston. He is also a clubman and a sportsman. The father of Mrs. Shaw, H. S. Eldridge, is a millionaire brewer of Portsmouth, N. H.

The boy will be taken to Los Angeles by the detectives.

Mrs. Shaw says she will fight for the possession of her boy.
