Politics and Politicians

Rumors regarding the appointment of Congressman Sidney Mudd to a judgeship in the circuit court of Maryland have been revived.

District Attorney Jerome has given positive and unqualified denial to the reports that he is to be a candidate for mayor of New York this fall.

J. Pope Brown, former railroad commissioner of Georgia, is claimed for the Democratic side central committee in Michigan.

Carter H. Harrison, who served four terms as mayor of Chicago, is expected to enter the race to succeed Mayor Busse when the latter's term expires.

E. C. Shields has been elected to succeed John T. Winship as chairman of the Democratic state central committee in Michigan.

Maryland suffragettes purpose to make a vigorous fight for woman suffrage in that state, continuing the campaign until the legislature meets next winter.

Charles M. Davis, a streetcar conductor and a member of the Omaha city council. He is an independent in politics and a representative of the labor element.

The longest term of service as a member of the cabinet is claimed for Gideon Granger of Connecticut, who was attorney general during a period of nearly 14 years, from 1851 to 1874.

Thomas L. Higen of Springfield, Mass., who was the presidential candidate of the independent party in 1868, denies the report that he was to become a candidate for the seat of Henry Cabot Lodge in the United States senate.

Corporation lawyers and men well known in the financial world are included in a new committee of 100, appointed by the Republican club of New York to conduct an all summer fight preparatory to the campaign against Tammany in the municipal election next fall.

Levi P. Morton, former governor of New York and vice president of the United States in the administration of President Harrison, observed his eighty-fifth birthday recently at his home in New York. He is in good health and continues to take an active interest in the many financial enterprises in which he is interested.

There are four states in which women have the full suffrage, Idaho, Colorado, Utah and Wyoming. In 28 additional states and one territory, Arizona, they may vote on school questions. These are Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Kansas, Michigan, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Mississippi, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Ohio, south

Dakota, Vermont, Washington and Wisconsin. In Louisiana women taxpayers may vote on taxation questions only. In Iowa also they may vote on bonding matters. In Minnesota they may vote for public library trustees. In Kansas they may vote at municipal elections and on bonding matters, and in Montana they may vote on bonding questions.

PHONY ARGENTINE COIN MAN SENTENCED
(United Press Leased Wire.)
Chicago, May 25.—Pleading guilty to the charge of complicity in a plot involving the passing of spurious coin of

Argentina Republic, Robert E. Scott of Alameda, Cal., has declared that Juan Sanitos, an official of the Argentine land office, originated the scheme. Scott was sentenced to three years' imprisonment. Scott told the court that he was sent to Argentina Republic by J. D. Fletcher, a California mining man, to purchase mineral lands. He said Sanitos offered to give him the land for nothing if he would furnish counterfeiting plates for five and ten peso pieces. He came to the United States and had the plates etched, but was arrested several weeks ago at Kokomo, Ind.
