Kansas City, May 29.—John Sharp, a religious fanatic known to his follow-ers as "Adam God," was today con-victed of the murder of Policeman Mul-lane and was sentenced to serve 25 years in the state prison. Sharp and a band of frenzied follow-ers were holding a street meeting here December 8 and by their shouts and antics attracted a crowd of curious spec-tators that blocked the traffic of the street.
