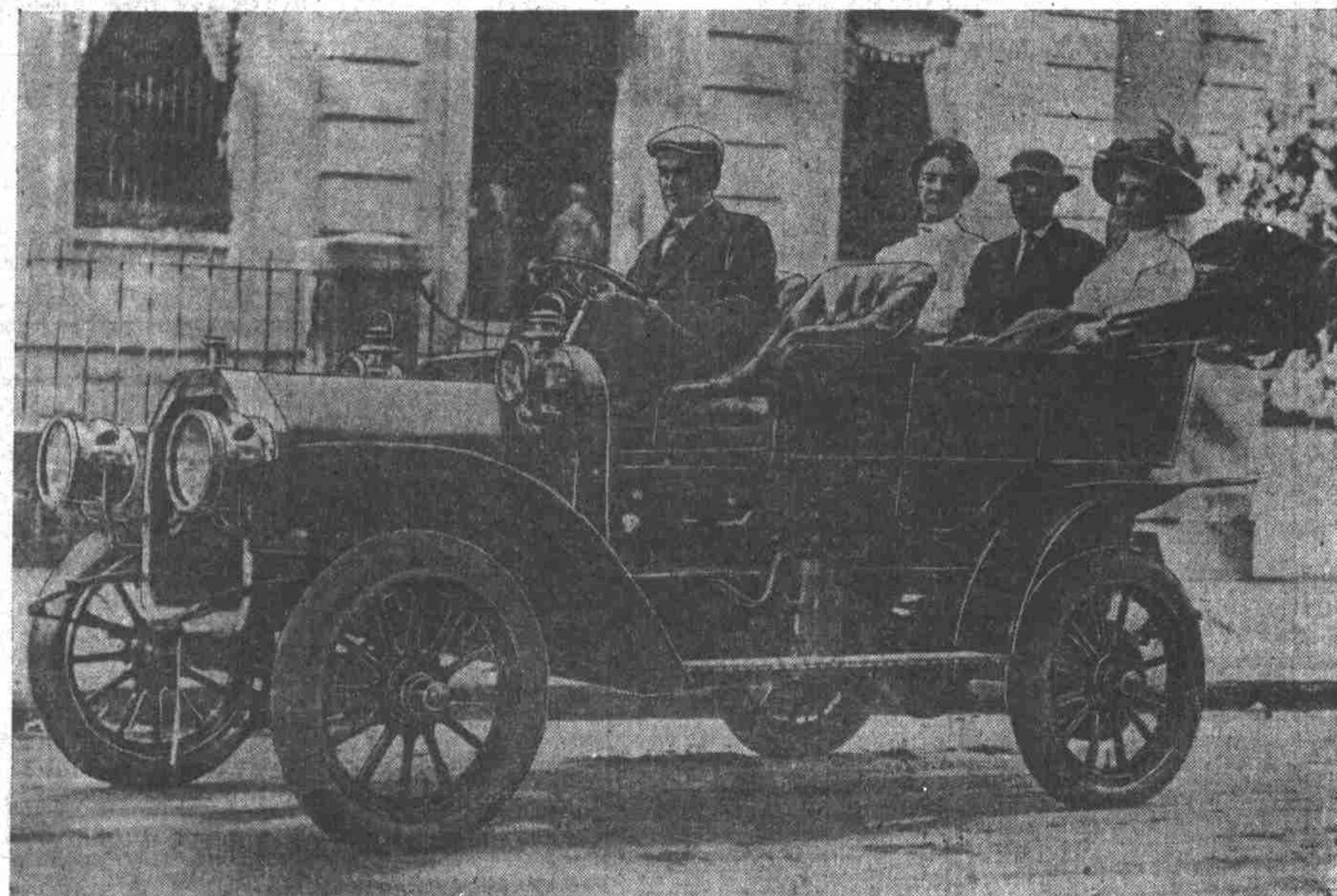

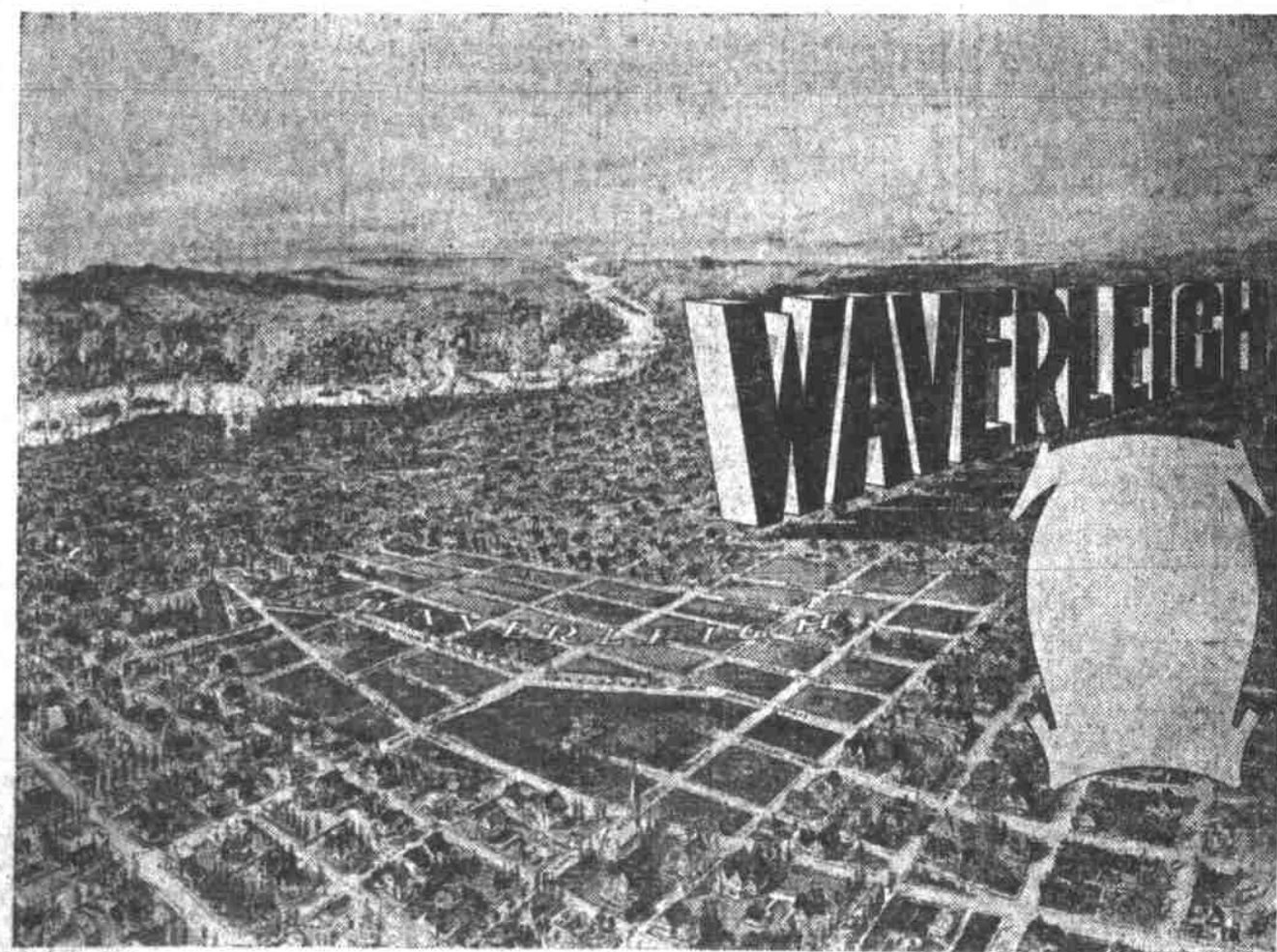

BRAKES—External contracting on differential, and internal expanding hub.
SPRINGS—Three-fourths elliptic in front, full elliptic in rear.
FRAME—Angle iron.
MOTOR—Double opposed, 22 H. P.
CYLINDERS—4½x6 inches.
VALVE ARRANGEMENT—In head of cylinder; cage and valve removable.

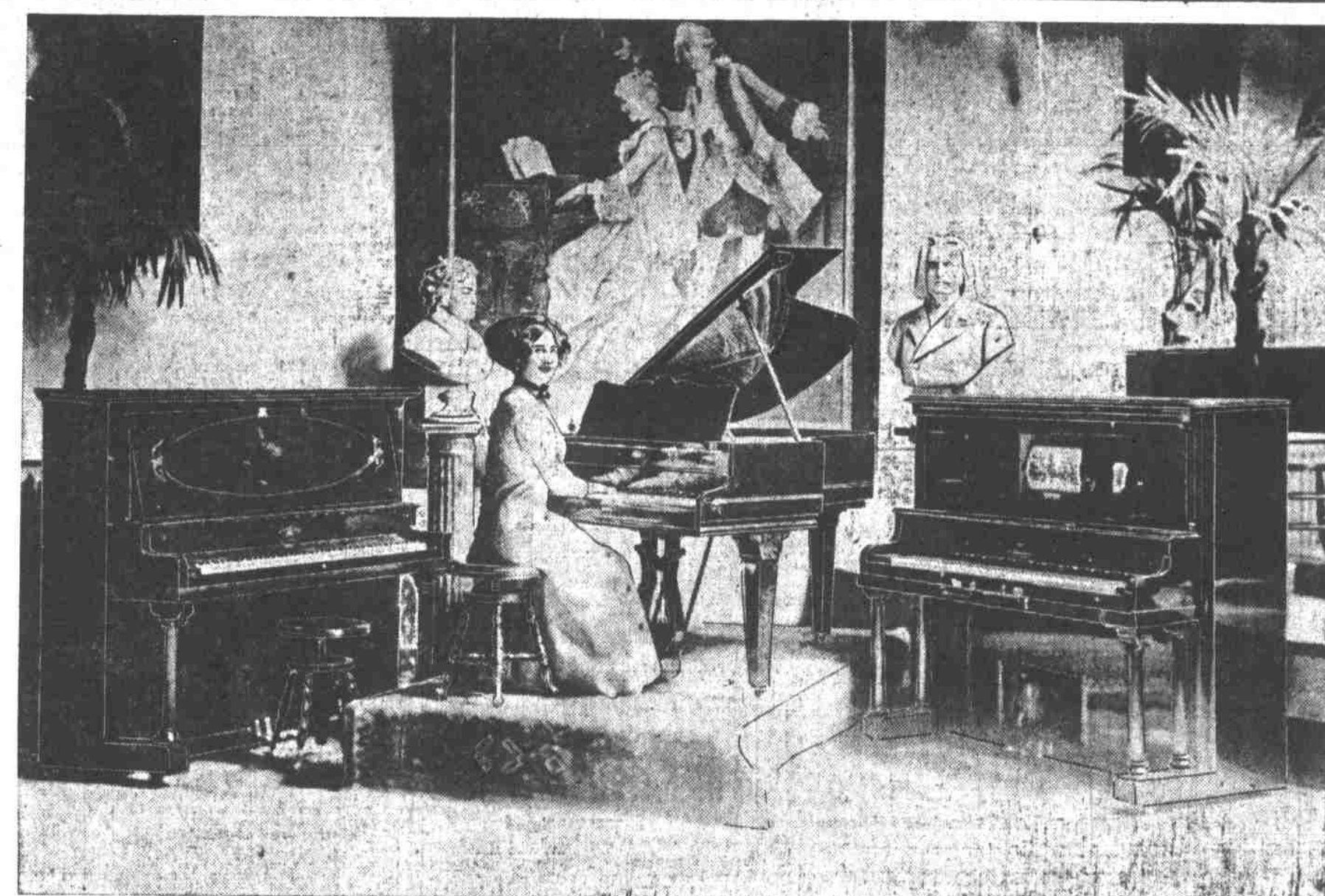

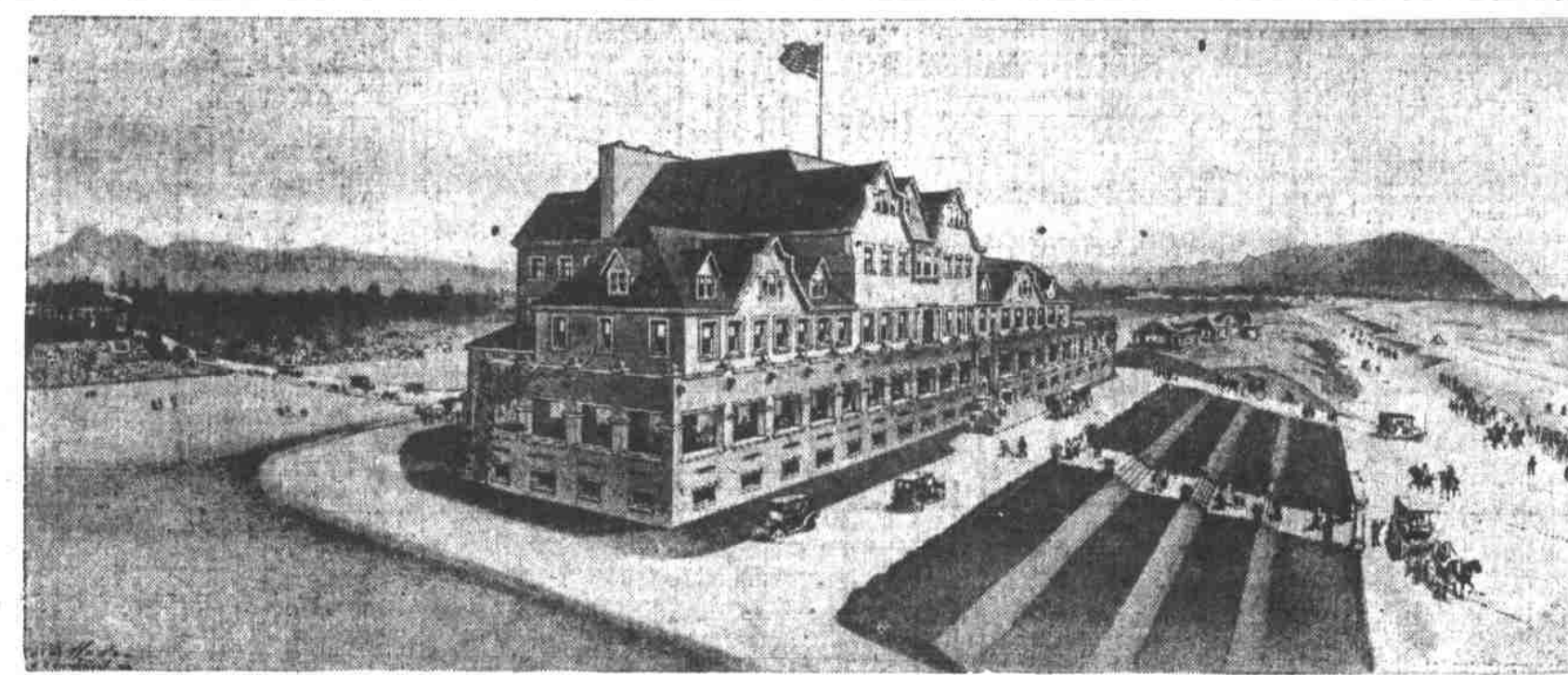

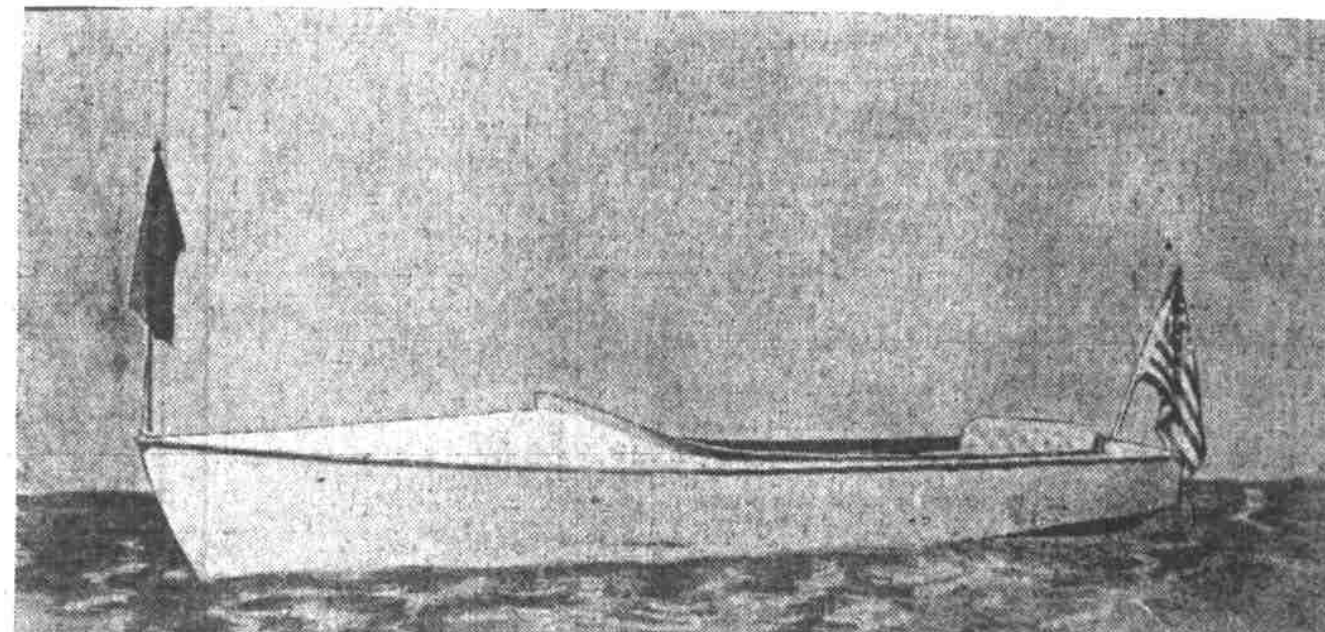
