Dentists Take Examinations—Examinations for practice in dentistry in this state under way before the state board of dental examiners this afternoon at the North Pacific Dental college, some 50 applicants having registered for the test. Each applicant must show a diploma from an accredited dental college and be eligible for the practical and theoretical test before the state board of examiners. He must prove by practical work that he understands the operations of filling, making plates and crowns before he can be granted a license to practice. The state board is composed of Dr. J. M. Yates, of Portland, president; Dr. Harry Olinger, of Salem, secretary; Mark Hayler, of Dr. A. S. Essen, of The Dalles, and Dr. Vaughn.
