JUST LOVELY TO GET MARRIED DURING ROSE FESTIVAL WEEK

June has thus far furnished an average of 12 brides per day in Multnomah county. This is a record breaking pace, and will hardly be maintained through the month, because many young people of poetic fancy and rosewater ideas have been waiting for weeks for June 1 to arrive, and rushed to the county clerk's office as soon as the calendar moved around to that date. Yet there is a chance for this high average to keep up, for the Cupids that hover around the marriage license counter are whispering that Washington's new law requiring a physical examination for male candidates for matrimony will drive the nymphetal tide this way. This is not so much because the young men shrink from examination, but because the cost of examination is likely to run into two figures. This will result in cheaper come to Portland to procure a license.

and be married than to be married in Washington. If the bride is a Washington girl, the person obtaining the license will be required to stretch the truth and swear that the girl is a resident of Portland, but this obstacle is surmounted with little difficulty in most cases. Unless the county clerk here personally knows that the girl is not a resident of the county, he cannot refuse the license when the proper affidavit is made. Another element that will hold up the June average is the Rose Carnival. "It will be just lovely to be married during the festival of the roses," say many of the girls, and there will be little rest for the clerk at the license counter this week. During the first five days in June 71 licenses were issued. At this rate the month's record would be over 400. In May, which is also a good month for marriages, 161 licenses were granted.
