WILLAMETTE HAS HUDSON BEATEN

Judge Golden Says Portland Scenery More Beautiful Than Eastern Heights.

"The approach to Portland on the Willamette is as beautiful as the Hudson river between West Point and New York," said Judge Theodore Golden of San Francisco, who is in Portland with Edmund Tausky, grand president of the Pacific coast division of the B'nai B'rith. Judge Golden is accompanying Mr. Tausky in place of Rabbi Nieto, on a tour of inspection of the various lodges of the coast cities. "Portland Heights I consider one of the most beautiful residential sections of any American city. This is my third visit here, and every time I come I find a vast improvement in the city. The new buildings which are worthy of a thriving city and a prosperous community. Portland is one of the most beautiful cities in the United States." President Tausky finds the Portland B'nai B'rith in a flourishing condition, doing enthusiastic and energetic work. "We have been received with more than ordinary hospitality and courtesy," he said, "although such seems to be the usual thing in Portland. It is especially pleasant to come to Portland after San Francisco. We are now engaged in the work of reconstruction, and while we have made great progress, there are still many vacant spaces." "By next February our new temple in San Francisco on Eddy street between Mason and Taylor, will be completed and the meeting of the Grand lodge will be held there." "The B'nai B'rith is doing excellent work in philanthropic and charitable

lines; it supports technical libraries, old people's homes, and its greatest achievement is the Denver hospital for consumptives, which is absolutely non-sectarian although supported by Jews."

The primary aim of the organization is not, however, philanthropic, but to better the conditions of the Jewish people.

NATIONAL GUARD HAS INSPECTION

300 Members of Regiment Gather at Armory for Quarterly Muster.

At last night's quarterly muster and inspection of the Third regiment, Oregon National Guard, the turnout of guardsmen was the largest in the history of this organization, over 300 officers and men being present. The huge galleries overlooking the Armory drill hall were well filled with spectators who greeted the appearance of each khaki clad company with a burst of applause. Colonel Charles E. McDonnell was in command with Major John H. May acting as lieutenant colonel. Majors F. S. Baker and T. N. Dunbar were in command of the battalions. The reviewing party was composed of Adjutant General W. E. Finzer, General C. F. Beebe, Judge C. U. Gantenbein, Major Greenleaf and Captain Frank Freeman. The companies were commanded as follows: Company E, Captain Charles Smith; company B, Captain W. W. Wilson; company F, Captain L. E. Croucher; company H, Captain Roy Dobie; company G, Captain R. O. Scott; company C, Captain Loren Bowman. The ambulance company was in command of Captain M. R. Marcelus. The regimental band, consisting of 46 pieces, was in excellent condition and gave every evidence of being one of the best National Guard bands in the country. Following the review, General Beebe congratulated the entire regiment upon its splendid form. Such a regiment,

said General Beebe, may well be looked upon by the national government as a part of its military force.

Teamster Is Exonerated.

George Evans, a teamster, arrested by Deputy Sheriff W. P. Lillis for obstructing the passage of a First street car called at The Journal office this morning to explain the circumstances under which the arrest was made. According to a press account of the affair the teamster's dray was loaded with granite at the time and he obstructed the track for two hours. Mr. Evans says this was a mistake. He says his dray was empty and was backed up in front of a machinery store at First and Pine streets to load an engine. Lillis, he says, swore in court that he is employed by the railway company. The motorman and conductor swore that the car was not delayed more than six minutes and that it contained no passengers. The charge against Mr. Evans fell flat and it was dismissed by Judge Van Zante.

The board of education at its meeting yesterday afternoon elected Mrs. May Gay of Portland and Miss Essie Robertson of Chicago assistant drawing teachers. Mrs. Gay will be assigned to the Jefferson High school and Miss Robertson will teach in the grammar grades. Automatic doors for all exits in public schools may be installed. The board ordered those recently put in the Lead school paid for and discussed the advisability of buying more. The automatic doors open outward and in case of fire the pressure of a crowd of pupils would release a spring and cause the door to fly open. Hereafter all the schools of the district may be insured under a blanket policy instead of each one separately. R. L. Sablin suggested this departure yesterday and it apparently seemed a good one to the other members. Mr. Sablin's plan will be taken up for consideration at the next meeting of the board.
