

INDUSTRIES OF THE GREATER PORTLAND DISTRICT

Government Issues Bulletin Relative to Manufacturing Centers and Their Relation to Contiguous Territory—Results of Department's Careful Investigation.

Bulletin 104, which has just been issued by the bureau of the census of the department of commerce and labor, Washington, D. C., deals with the manufacturing industries of the principal industrial districts in the United States. This report was prepared under the supervision of William M. Stewart, chief statistician for manufactures. It is illustrated with maps showing the cities and townships of the districts, with the steam and electric railways, rivers and canals.

Heretofore census statistics of manufactures have been presented by specified industries only for establishments grouped according to their location in cities of a certain size, counties, states or groups of states. This method, however, does not indicate the importance of industries in the various contiguous localities, since industries are not limited by political divisions. An industrial district may include a number of counties and states as well as the intervening and surrounding minor civil divisions, all being politically independent, but closely allied industrially. The statistics have a bearing on the question whether manufactures are leaving the larger cities for places immediately surrounding them.

Industries Center Around Cities. The manufactures carried on in the sections immediately surrounding the principal cities which form the centers of the districts are largely controlled by capital owned by residents of the cities. A considerable proportion of the employees reside within the cities, and frequently the cities are the principal distributing points for the products of other ways the industries are so closely allied to the cities that they should be credited to the urban rather than to the rural manufactures. Therefore, to convey a true idea of the industrial importance of a district, the data should include statistics closely associated with these cities in their industrial development. This bulletin has been prepared to show much more than the industrial districts for the years covered by the censuses of 1900 and 1905.

The inclusion of the territory surrounding the central cities in these districts has added 283,644 square miles, or 261.8 per cent, to the area immediately surrounding the central cities. The industrial districts contained manufacturing plants valued at \$1,762,022,774, or 15.6 per cent, of the total value of the manufactures of the United States in 1905. The industrial districts and these surrounding places together contained a population of 17,297,892 in 1900 and in 1905 had 7,816 factories employing 2,609,744 salaried persons and wage earners and manufacturing products valued at \$7,438,388,412.

The Districts Included. The district of Greater New York is the most important industrial district in the United States. It embraces an area of 202 square miles. In 1905 it had a population of 5,294,682. There is no district in the United States with which it can be grouped. The districts of Chicago, Philadelphia and Boston have been classed together, since their population in 1900 ranged between one and two millions and their areas were practically the same, being about 600 square miles. In a third class are the districts of St. Louis, St. Paul, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Cincinnati, San Francisco, Cleveland, Buffalo, and Minneapolis-St. Paul. They had a population in 1900 ranging from 618,157 to 1,349,594 and areas ranging from 246 square miles for Baltimore to 151 square miles for Cincinnati. The Providence district, with a population of 344,521 in 1905 and an area of 164 square miles, can not be compared with any other district presented in the bulletin.

The statistics show that in 12 of the districts the manufactures increased rapidly in the area immediately surrounding the central city than in the area within the corporate limits of the city. The only district in which the city had the greater increase was that of Minneapolis-St. Paul.

In relative increase in the value of products in 1905 as compared with 1900 the Buffalo district ranked first, with a gain of 48.2 per cent. The increase for the city itself was 39.8 per cent and for the surrounding places 16.7 per cent. The value of the products manufactured in Pittsburgh and Allegheny decreased 5.3 per cent, but the value of the outside places entering about these cities increased 11.6 per cent. Industries reporting fewer than three establishments in 1900 are shown separately. Thus it is that a number of important industries in various districts are not given except in the total for all industries. Decreases in individual returns is thus avoided.

Products of More Than \$2,000,000,000. Products valued at \$2,144,488,932 were manufactured in the factories of the industrial district of Greater New York.
