Beavers Lose Another Game in South—Olson Makes Only Score

San Francisco, July 1.—Garrett was pounded hard in the second inning yesterday and the Oaks made enough runs to clinch the game. The Beavers made one run in the first inning by virtue of Olson's long lucky triple and McCredie's infield out.

Oakland made one in the first, but put over three in the second. Carl Lewis, Tonnesson and Murphy secured singles. Carroll squeezed Carl Lewis home and Duffy Lewis ripped off a two bagger that rattled the Beavers in right just above McCredie's head.

A two bagger by Carroll following a walk by Tonnesson and a single by Murphy put the pitcher over the rubber.

North Carolina Has New Auto Law.

Charlotte, N. C., July 1.—A new automobile law went into effect in North Carolina today. It imposes a registra-

on tax of \$5, with an annual renewal fee of \$1. Speed is limited to 25 miles an hour on rural roads and 13 miles in incorporated towns, except in business portions, where eight miles is the limit. One of the strange features of the measure is that it exempts from its operation the seacoast county of New Hanover, in which the city of Wilmington is located.

IN THE

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NEW ESPEE BRIDGE OVER SACRAMENTO

(Continued From Last Week's Wire.)

Sacramento, July 1.—Within two years the Southern Pacific company will construct a double track concrete bridge over the Sacramento river at this point. The plans, according to T. R. Jones, who appeared before the county supervisors in behalf of the company, call for the outlay of \$1,000,000. Jones asked for a conference between the supervisors of Yolo county to approve the plans.

The new bridge will be built several hundred feet above the present structure.

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
