

GREAT LEAGUE MEETING AT SEATTLE

Ten Thousand Young Methodists of All Ages Assemble in International Convention — Preliminaries Make Day's Program.

(United Press Licensed Wire.)
Seattle, July 7.—With 10,000 Methodists in attendance, the eighth international convention of the Epworth league met at 2 o'clock today in the Armory building and will continue in convention and sightseeing for six days. Welcoming addresses and responses consumed the time of the first session. Mayor John F. Miller representing the city of Seattle, the Rev. John P. Marlett, D. D., representing the Methodist ministry of the Seattle district, and Bishop Charles W. Smith of Portland representing the Methodists of the northwest.

Responses were made by the Rev. J. E. Moore, D. D., Fresno, Cal., for the Methodist Episcopal church, South; the Rev. A. C. Crowe, D. D., Toronto, for the Canadian Methodist church, and Bishop William A. Quayle of Oklahoma, president of the Epworth league, for the Methodist Episcopal church, Bishop Edwin H. Hughes of San Francisco presided.

The board of control of the Epworth league finished its annual meeting this morning in an executive session at the First Methodist church. The business sessions of the convention will begin tomorrow morning.

Trains with delegates arrived during the day, but several of the foreign delegates are tied up in Colorado.

Headquarters have been opened for the various state and conference departments. Ballies of these departments have been arranged in addition to the stated program.

remain in possession of the city until next Monday. The occasion is the twenty-fourth international convention of the Christian Endeavor societies. The Epworth league will conduct several institutes this summer.

The Epworth league is the largest denominational young people's society of the world. It was organized in 1885 at Cleveland, Ohio, by consolidating five Methodist societies of similar character. In the Methodist churches throughout the world, the Epworth league, named after Epworth, England, the birthplace of John Wesley, now claims 2,000,000 members in 25,000 chapters. In 1905 there were 244 chapters and 1845 young societies in the United States alone. In Canada the Epworth league affiliates with the Christian Endeavor society. The league is doing some valuable work among the negro and foreign elements of America's population. It has established manual training schools and numerous charitable and educational institutions. It has 4500 members in India alone and its branches in Hawaii. It carries on an elaborate system of mission study.

Baptist Young People's Union.
The Baptist Young People's union of America was organized at Philadelphia in 1881 and now has a membership of over 500,000 in the United States and Canada. It will hold a convention at Saratoga, N. Y., this month. The Epworth league has a young people's organization of 15,000 members in 400 societies. The Epworth league convention has the Royal Ambassadors' society for boys, while in the Northern Baptist convention there is a boys' society known as the Missionary Gardeners.

Both the Baptist Young People's union and the Lutheran league, the corresponding organization in the Lutheran church in America, which was formed at Pittsburgh in 1895, and which has a membership of 100,000 in 25 states, are more or less closely affiliated with the Christian Endeavor society. The Young People's Christian Union, a United Brethren church, organized at Dayton, Ohio, in 1880, is said to be a compromise between the denominational and

interdenominational ideas. It has 100,000 members. There is a society bearing the same name in the Universalist church, which was started at Lynn, Massachusetts in 1890.

Other Organizations.
The Young People's Missionary Movement had its first convention at Pittsburgh last year. Its purpose is to keep in touch with missionaries of various denominations throughout the world. The King's Daughters and the International Society of King's Daughters and Sons, with an estimated membership of 500,000 in America, were the outgrowth of a suggestion of the late Rev. Edward Everett Hale, as were the many "Lend a Hand" clubs and "Ten Times 1 is 10" clubs which began to flourish in the early seventies and now number tens of thousands of members.

The quadrennial gathering of the Student volunteers is an important event in the religious movement among the young. The work of the Young Men's and Young Women's Christian associations is well known. The Boys' Brigade and the George Junior Republic are boys' organizations of 100,000 or more members conducted under church auspices. Even the Woman's Christian Temperance Union has a branch for young people. The American Sunday School union, organized in 1824, participated in an international convention at Jerusalem in 1904.
