

Anarchy and Sedition Discouraged by Special Tribunal of Summary Powers—But Will the Hindu Stay Suppressed?

Deportation Thried; Falls.
This condition of things could not be permitted to continue, and the government has decided to take prompt action. Two agitators in the northwest portion of India had been deported for written and speaking sedition. The deportation was carried out under a law of 1918, a survival of the old East India Company's law. A new law, to take its place had been enacted to rid Calcutta of an English editor who was annoying the company. After 90 years of existence the company was brought to a sudden and complete end.
