MANY SAD ONES SEEK TO BE HEARD

Police Sergeant Riley appealed to the civil service commission at its meeting yesterday afternoon for a re-arranging of his papers on the examination records

held to secure an eligible for the position of police captain. The appeal was referred to the secretary of the commission, with instructions for him to report at the next session as to whether or not the contention of Sergeant Riley is well grounded. The disgruntled policeman claims that he was marked too low on questions as to the practical duties of detectives.

Mayor Simon presided for the first time over the commission and A. P. Armstrong, who was appointed to take the place of Commissioner J. M. Blain, resigned, was also present. The commission granted the appeal

of former Street Inspectors Ohlert, Shrake and Merges for hearings. The inspectors were dismissed by City Engineer Taylor on charges of neglect of duty. Ex-Assistant Engineer Hannan, who also appealed from the action of the Lane executive board, which dismissed him, was granted a hearing. All four hearings will be held Saturday morning. E. Dunlap, a stoker on the fireboat George H. Williams, will be tried before the commission on a charge of insubordination.

The eligibility terms for five applicants for the position of master mechanic in the fire department were extended 30 days in order that the fire committee of the new executive board may have an opportunity to choose one of the men. It is regarded as practically certain that Hydrantman Walter J. Phillips will be appointed to the position, as he has always been strongly recommended for the place by Fire Chief Campbell. Mayor Lane and his fire committee refused to consider Phillips for the position, because they believed his character was not good enough. Phillips was charged with using his position as hydrantman to further his own financial interests, and as evidence of this a contract was produced by the

committee showing that Phillips was to receive a certain sum of money for every hydrant of a particular type sold. On account of this testimony Mayor Lane and his board decided that Phillips was unfit to hold office, no matter what his qualifications as a mechanic might be.

They refused to appoint any of the others on the eligible list because the mayor said the examinations given by the commission were so farcical that a monkey in the City park zoo might easily have passed them.

Entertained Sincer, All Right. (United Press Special Wire.) Berkeley, Cal. July 8.—Left to entertain his little sister while mother was away, 7-year-old Christian House gave two fingers of his right hand to the cause. The children were playing in the yard and the little sister, who is 5 years old, had been cutting grass roots with a sharp hatchet. She asked her brother to lay his hand on a chopping block, and let her chop it. The lad complied and the little girl with one stroke severed two fingers as cleanly as a surgeon might. The boy was rushed to a hospital.

Prosser Votes Bonds. Prosser, Wash. July 8.—Prosser voted \$10,000 worth of bonds at the special school election Saturday. There were 51 votes for and one against. The bonds will be used in building a new school in Buena Vista section of district No. 18. Rapid settlement of irrigated lands has made this necessary. County Treasurer Walker has announced that he will sell in a few days another issue of \$600 worth of bonds for Finley, making a total of \$16,000 for that district this year; also \$1500 worth of bonds for Hanford, as well as the Prosser bonds.
