

MAYOR ASKED FOR ANIMAL CLOWNS FIVE CONCERTS WAKE YOU LAUGH

Kenilworth Improvement Club Takes Up Battle for Rosebrook's Band. Big Circus Holds Continual Struggle of Laughs, Howls and Thrills for All.

At its regular semi-monthly meeting last evening the Kenilworth Improvement association unanimously adopted a resolution offered by John R. Tomlinson that "this association favors compliance with the contract verbally entered into by the park commissioners of the city of Portland last February, with the representative of a large number of musicians, for five concerts per week in the parks of Portland, at a compensation of \$4 per night per musician, and that the secretary of this association convey to Mayor Simon the sense of this resolution.

It was explained by Mr. Tomlinson that the mayor has notified the musicians that but three concerts per week would be paid for a position not considered fair after a verbal agreement for five concerts per week had been made, and feeling upon this engagement many band men had declined other offers for the summer.

The association adopted a resolution favoring the improvement of all streets in Kenilworth on the district plan, and a committee consisting of J. F. McQuaid, E. F. Moldenhauer, J. Compton and Perry Tomlinson was appointed to secure signatures to petitions necessary for presentation to the city council.

It was reported that Mayor Simon had been interviewed in relation to the purchase of four, three and 10 acre park sites for Kenilworth, Richmond and Brooklyn additions, and that he had promised to give the subject attention in an early date.

Lights will be asked for in this section, on East Thirty-second and Powell and East Thirty-ninth and Francis avenues.

The association also passed a resolution urging the mayor to appoint C. E. Rieand as a representative of the east side, and the secretary was instructed to convey to his honor this desire of the association.

COLONEL C. A. DOYEN TELLS TALE AS IT WAS TOLD TO HIM

Annapolis, Md., July 13.—Discussing the recent order of the Washington court ordering a reopening of the case of Lieutenant James N. Sutton of the United States marine corps, who died in a bullet wound after a quarrel with his brother officers two years ago, Colonel Charles A. Doyen, commandant of the barracks here, recounted the circumstances as he recalled them.

Doyen was one of the first of the superior officers of the barracks to reach Sutton's side. He said the shooting followed a quarrel and that other officers who were with Sutton explained the circumstances to him, which he related as follows:

"As Lieutenant Osterman turned away Lieutenant Sutton struck him on the side of the head with his fist.

"As a blow had not passed, Lieutenant Utley, who had stopped them before, said they must fight. Lieutenant Osterman and Sutton stripped to their shirt sleeves, and after a few blows, Lieutenant Sutton was knocked down. He lay still refusing to get up.

"The others started away, when Sutton jumped up and made an attempt on Lieutenant Adams, Adams knocked him down. Lieutenant Sutton, infuriated, again got up and, with rough language, rushed to his tent, where he hid.

"I will shoot every one of you before morning," he said.

"Meanwhile, Lieutenant Roelker, who had come in before and whose tent adjoined Sutton's heard a disturbance in the latter's tent and came to the entrance to investigate.

"Then Sutton rushed out of his tent with a revolver in each hand. Roelker followed him. Sutton met Adams on the road with several others and fired.

"One of the shots struck Lieutenant Roelker, who dropped to the ground. Lieutenant Adams thereupon rushed toward Lieutenant Sutton, who was still firing. Lieutenant Adams grappled with Lieutenant Sutton and threw him.

"Almost at the same time some one said: 'My God, men, he's killed Lieutenant Roelker!'

"Thereupon, Lieutenant Sutton pulled his right hand from under his body and fired a shot which entered his head about an inch from the right eye and an inch and a half from the ear, which bullet, it was found, passed downward and came out slightly below the left ear on the left side of his neck.

"The officer of the day, Lieutenant Willing, who was standing in front of Lieutenant Sutton and about three feet from his head, reached over and took the revolver from Lieutenant Sutton's hand.

"Lieutenant Roelker was picked up unconscious and assisted to the barracks. This is the substance of what Lieutenant Utley told me and what I have learned from other sources."

SAYS RUNAWAY TRAIN HAS DISABLED HIM

Alleging that he was permanently injured when he jumped from a runaway logging train, August Johannsson has brought suit in circuit court against the Bradley Logging company of Portland for \$25,000 damages. He is represented by Willeit, Olson & Willeit, a Seattle firm of attorneys.

Johannsson alleges in his complaint that he went to work for the logging company April 7, this year, and the next day was ordered to act as brakeman on the company's logging train, operating near Cathlamet, Wash. He objected, according to the complaint, but was nevertheless forced to do as ordered. While on the train, Johannsson alleges it became unmanageable and ran away, jumping the track. To escape danger, Johannsson declares he jumped and received injuries which will prevent him from manual labor hereafter. He is 27 years old.
