

DENTAL COLLEGE PLANS NEW HOME



Home of North Pacific Dental College as It Will Appear when Completed.

The North Pacific College of Dentistry has had plans prepared for a new dental college building to be erected in Portland which will be one of the handsomest educational institutions of its kind in the country. The building is to be erected on the half block on the west side of East Sixth street, between Pacific and Oregon streets, a

site recently purchased by the college. The building is to be of concrete construction, four stories high, with classic outline, Corinthian columns and ivory white exterior. The principal college buildings in the United States have been visited for the purpose of studying their architecture, equipment and arrangement, with the result that this building will be one of the most perfect for the purpose for which it is intended so far erected in the United States.

This institution is essentially a growth of Portland. It had its beginning some years ago when Portland was but little more than a town and under the efficient management of the faculty and officers it has grown to be one of the leading dental colleges on the Pacific coast and is recognized as one of the best institutions of the kind in the United States. The board of directors is composed of Herbert C. Miller, president and treasurer; James R. Cardwell, vice president; Louis J. Fitzpatrick, secretary; Everett M. Hurd and John F. Kinney.

GOOD ROADS CLUB
FACES DISRUPTION

Supervisor Henderson Said to Have Ignored Wishes of Klickitat Combine.

Bristol, Wash., July 17.—The Central Good Roads club and Supervisor J. E. Henderson of road district No. 1 are at loggerheads over the distribution and control of district road money. So acute is the disagreement that the Central club, which is composed of delegates from the Bristol Development club, Bingen Commercial club and Cook's Addition Development club, at the adjourned meeting held yesterday at Bingen, instructed its secretary, Clyde M. Nichols of Bristol, to write to County Commissioner J. H. Morison to ascertain if Mr. Henderson was to recognize or ignore the club's recommendations as to road work, as he is said to have done.

This action was only taken, it was said by the Bristol Development club's delegates in their report to their home club at its meeting yesterday evening, after repeated requests for a report from Mr. Henderson as to funds available for appropriation for road work had been ignored. The conditions under which Henderson was appointed were unusual in the political game. Mr. Morison, after his election last fall, suggested the organization of the Central club for the general good of the road district, which is the smallest in the county, though covering a large number of miles owing to the location of its subdivisions. Henderson was its first secretary and during his incumbency as the minutes of the club in his handwriting show, was the father of a motion that the club direct the supervisor as to where work should be done on roads and how much money should be expended therefor. Shortly after this, at the suggestion of Commissioner Morison, an election—not legal or binding, but merely to show the choice of the people—was held, at which Henderson received the most votes and was appointed supervisor by Morison.

Now the Central club, through its secretary, seeks an expression from Morison as to whether he intends to uphold his appointee in ignoring the club's recommendations and requests or give the club the power it was organized to exert, in accordance with his promise of recognition. An unfavorable decision will probably mean the disruption of the club.

APACHES YEARN FOR
RETURN TO FREEDOM

Lawton, Okla., July 17.—Chief Asa Deklugia, a nephew by marriage of the late Geronimo, war chief of the Apaches, who now legally heads the entire Apache prisoners of war at Fort Sill, has gone to the Mescalero reservation in New Mexico, where he hopes to find conditions favorable to a transfer of the Apaches from Oklahoma to that reservation.

While several of the Apaches desire to remain under the protection of the war department at Fort Sill, the greater portion of the 250 war prisoners are united upon the movement to secure their liberty and be permitted to take up allotment in the western territory, where the older ones of the tribe once held supremacy. The new chief will return in 10 days with his report for the government, as well as for the tribe.

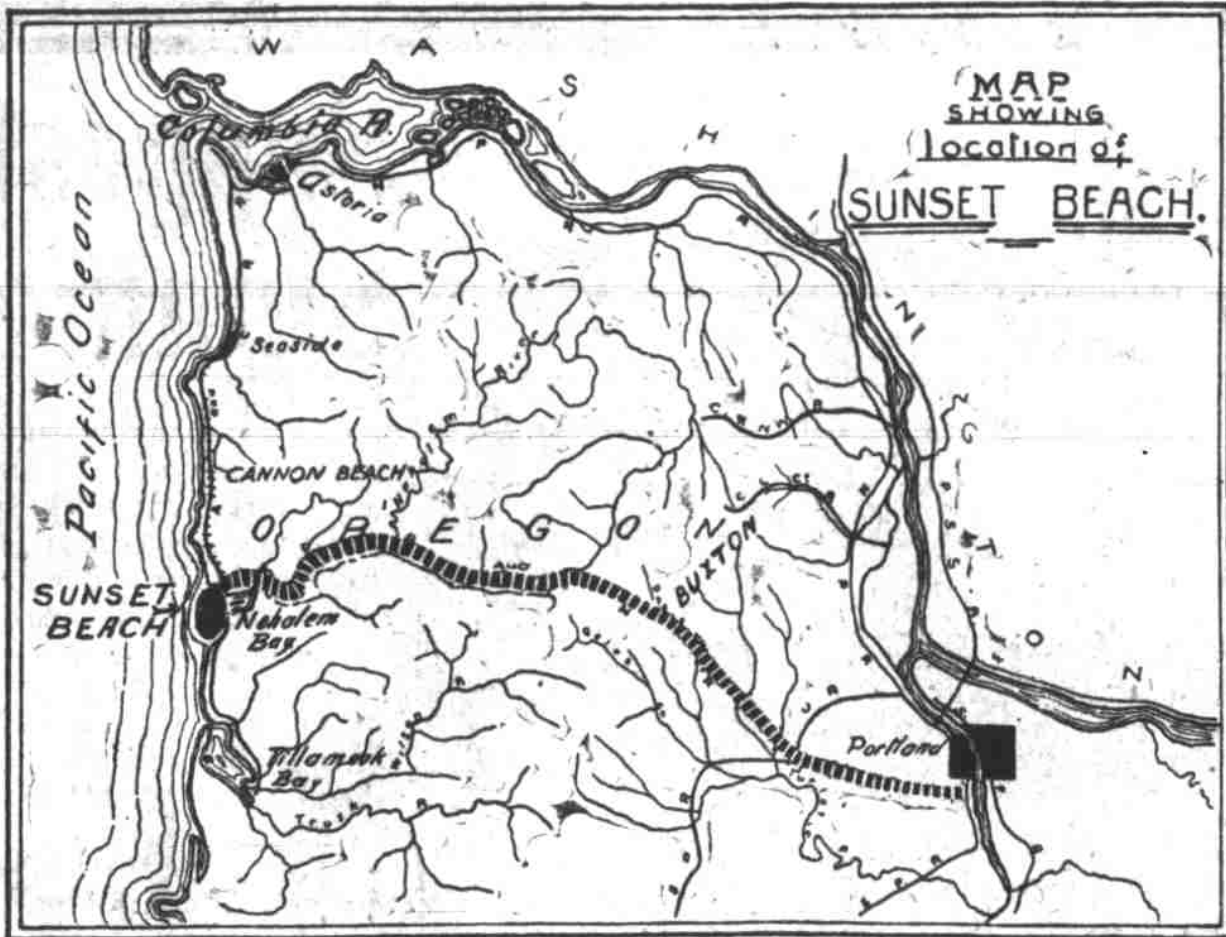
