

COSTLY ERROR CAUSES WORRY

Washington State Legislature Makes Blunder That Must Be Remedied.

Tacoma, Wash., July 20.—The trouble that is said invariably to follow the attempt to do too much has resulted from the efforts of the last Washington state legislature. Among a host of other errors and eccentricities it has been discovered by an astute prosecuting attorney down in Mount Vernon, Skagit county, that the legislature repeated the error of providing for the licensing of saloons outside of the corporate limits of cities by the county commissioners and put nothing in its stead. It was intended that this matter should be covered in the new criminal code that was enacted and whose extraordinary provisions have caused the courts and prosecutors much worry, but some way it was overlooked.

Under the present laws the only restrictions on the establishment of roadhouses on the principal thoroughfares just outside the city limits or wherever the wayfarer is likely to be most thirsty are the federal and state license fees of \$15 each per annum. Formerly a \$500 county license was also required.

County Authorities Helpless.
In the opinion of the best lawyers of the state, including Prosecuting Attorney McManus, the county commissioners can do nothing to prevent the opening up of saloons wherever the proprietors are willing to pay the state and federal license fees. Several communities which have come before the county commissioners and successfully opposed the granting of a saloon license in their locality will now find themselves helpless.

This is not the worst of the situation, however. It appears that the counties will have to refund to saloonists the amount of licenses taken out since the new law went into effect.

In Pierce county two saloons have taken out the county license and enriched the county treasury by \$100. In the opinion of good lawyers their proprietors, E. T. Brown of Kapowsin, and Eber Swanson, have a good show of recovering that amount if they start suit against the county officers, inasmuch as apparently there is no color of law for the collection of the license.

But One Act to Hamper Business.
There is but one act now on the statute books which will in any way hamper the business of the saloon without a county license. This is an act prohibiting unlicensed places from retailing lager beer or from selling liquors in greater quantities than gallon lots. This is interpreted as not applying to beer in bottles and therefore will not seriously affect the roadhouse business.

An effort will be made to have the legislature take steps to remedy the situation it has created when it meets in extraordinary session August for the consideration of the impeachment of Insurance Commissioner Schively.

Both Houses Responsible.
Finally the article states that "since judgment was rendered, the proper sphere of activity has been the house."
