

RECLAMATION PROJECT NEEDS MONEY

Oregon Irrigation Plans Not to Be Extended—Harney and Malheur Schemes Are Passed Up—Umatilla and Klamath Get Aid.

No new government irrigation projects will be commenced in Oregon this year. E. G. Henson, supervising engineer for the Pacific district, which includes Oregon, made this statement yesterday.

"There isn't money enough in the government fund," he added in explanation.

Mr. Henson's outline of reclamation policy for Oregon unwillingly leaves the big Malheur and Crooked river projects, recently investigated by Secretary of the Interior R. A. Ballinger, out in the cold. But the project now under way at Umatilla and Klamath will likely be materially extended.

To show why this apportionment is almost certain, Mr. Henson produced some figures.

"To begin with," he said, "government engineers are asking for the projects in their charge an appropriation of \$17,000,000. The actual fund for disbursement is only \$11,000,000, less than half the amount asked for. None of us is going to get as much as we have asked for. I made my request for Oregon's appropriation as big as I could, but I wanted to get all I could for the state.

Get Public Land Money.
"It is a matter of common knowledge that each state is to receive 61 per cent of the money accruing from the sale of public lands in that state, to be devoted to the reclamation of that state's arid lands. Oregon's sales for 1908 amount to \$3,300,000. Fifty-one per cent of that amount gives the state \$1,677,000. Already there has been spent \$2,770,000, leaving \$1,400,000 for Oregon which should be spent by the end of 1909. But as a matter of fact it is not required that this money be spent before the end of 1911. In the meantime the money accruing from the sale of additional lands will probably make the whole sum to be spent before the end of 1912 something like \$2,300,000.

That shows why Malheur and Crooked river can scarcely be commenced this year. We want to be able to finish what we start. Klamath and Umatilla projects can be materially extended with the funds we have at our disposal. The lands in the upper valley of the Klamath can be irrigated and water brought to the lands west of Umatilla river.

May Not Decide.
"Nor," concluded Mr. Henson, "is it certain that the meeting held by the board of advisory engineers with Secretary Ballinger tomorrow will result in final decision on his report as to the apportionment of funds. He may simply gather information and report his decisions after that. But don't mind saying that the sooner the secretary announces his decision the better we will be satisfied, and so will the people of Oregon, so far as the projects immediately under my supervision are concerned, for I have rarely seen them so interested in anything.

To the same degree that the people of Oregon are concerned in government reclamation of arid lands do the people of all western states consider the matter of reclamation along with the conservation of water power vital to the development of every western interest.

Sited in the office of D. C. Henry, consulting engineer for the government reclamation service, five supervising engineers for the United States spoke casually of plans to save the land from the blight of drought schemes in their immediacy enough to stagger the mind of the layman who listened, but which these men discussed without excitement but earnestly.

Story a Vast One.

One by one the five supervising engineers told the story of the work they are doing to save the land from the blight of drought schemes in their immediacy enough to stagger the mind of the layman who listened, but which these men discussed without excitement but earnestly.

Fifteen days ago I. W. McConnell, from Colorado, arrived in Oregon to take charge of the reclamation service, finished the Gunnison irrigation tunnel, six miles long, after a struggle of four years, and when the forces of nature and the engines of men. The formal opening of the tunnel is to occur very soon, and President Taft is to be the guest of honor on that occasion.

"The tunnel cost \$2,000,000," Mr. McConnell related, "the waters of the Gunnison river into the Uncompagnie valley and waters 140,000 acres of what will prove to be some of the best fruit and sugar best land in the world.

The land will be similar to that in the Yakima and Hood River valleys of Oregon. But to put it into proper working order, the state of Colorado is to be supplemented by \$2,000,000 worth of canals.

Began in 1905.

"We began our work in 1905, with two headings working continuously toward each other. We penetrated one mile of water bearing sand and gravel, two miles of blue shale and three of granite rock. Our work would have been completed much sooner but for the heavy flows of gas or choke damp that made work impossible and endangered the lives of men.

"Two miles from the portal, at one time, water 35 degrees hot burst out upon us. To maintain any sort of ventilation, it was necessary to sink an air shaft 700 feet deep from the surface of the earth and all the time 100 horsepower ventilating apparatus was kept going. At one place—we called it a 'faul'—we found coal, disintegrated rock, hard sandstone and granite, where hard pumping was necessary to keep the shaft clear.

Contractors Gave Up.
"The work was taken over by the government after the contractors who first took hold of it had given up the project in dismay. Now we have 50,000,000 gallons of water monthly to land."

Mr. McConnell has been building, too, the Pathfinder dam, which impounds the waters of the North Platte river. This dam is 114 feet high, will irrigate 100,000 acres of land, and is holding 1,025,000 acre feet, which, to be reduced to gallons, must be multiplied by 800,000. The land benefited by this project is situated in Wyoming and Nebraska.

Showing the value of irrigation, this one reservoir, costing only \$15,000,000, all expenses counted in, will create value of \$100,000,000.

The Belle Fourche dam, which Mr. McConnell has been building, is the highest earth dam in the world, having a section of 118 feet, costing \$1,000,000.

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Goes Many Places.

Mr. McConnell's duties take him into southeastern Wyoming, Colorado, Oklahoma, Kansas, Wyoming and Nebraska. One of his most interesting projects is being operated at Garden City, Kan., where 100,000 acres of land with water irrigated 100,000 acres of desert land with water diverted from the Arkansas river.

Louis C. Hill is supervising engineer of the reclamation service for what is known as the southern district, including California, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas and Utah, and covering the drainage systems of the Colorado and Rio Grande rivers. Very calmly and methodically he proceeded to list the rushing waters of the Colorado from their deep canyon, where for thousands of years they have run to waste, to the desert lands on every side. Incidentally it is the biggest irrigation project in the history of the world. No one knows yet what the cost of the project is to be, yet it will cost \$10,000,000 and will reclaim thousands upon thousands of acres of desert lands in several states.

Another Vast Project.
One of Mr. Hill's most immediate interests is the completion of the Salt River project, which is to cost \$3,500,000. It includes the Roosevelt dam 254 feet high and will store 1,000,000 acre feet of water, the largest reservoir in the world at the present time. This project is now 50 per cent completed.

"Just at the present time," Mr. Hill said humorously, "I have given up active operations, because I have been down there so long that it cracks the marrow of my bones to think of it."

"But doesn't it endanger the lives of the workmen?" he was asked. "The engineers are easy to find again," the engineer answered with apparent seriousness.

The Salt River project provides water for 40,000 acres of land. It is supplied with water from underground veins pumped to the surface by power originating at the dam. In addition, water is pumped for 10,000 acres of land on an Indian reservation. The reason for the dam is itself supplies water for 200,000 acres of land, 100,000 acres of which is now under cultivation, producing wheat, alfalfa, oranges and dates.

Country Is Beautiful.
"It is a wonderfully beautiful country," said Mr. Hill. "On one side are the cool green fields to which the water has come; on the other side the end of the world, where we have not reached yet."

Just at this point Mr. Hill broke into his description to tell a story. "Senator Ben Tillman came down to see the project and I showed him the dam. He was very interested. I told him that Roosevelt was just being completed. He said, 'I hope the dam is not too big for the country.'"

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
