

HUSBANDS MUST PAY OR RUN AWAY

New Non-Support Law Im-
presses Officials as Be-
ing Good Measure.

District prosecutors and employees in the office of the county clerk have brought to the notice of the public the success of the non-support law, passed by the state legislature about a year and a half ago, which deems failure to support wife or child a misdemeanor on the part of the husband.

Great evidence of the success of the new law may be had in the office of the county clerk, where the records show that while during the year and a half just passed, 24 complaints against alleged unsupporting spouses have been filed, there has not yet been a conviction, and no rockpile sentences have been served.

The law specifically declares that any man who, without just and sufficient cause, fails to support his wife or child, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and sentenced to the county jail for a term of not less than 30 days or more than one year. It is further laid out that in event of such conviction the husband shall be compelled to work on the public roads or on other public works, and that during the term of his imprisonment the family shall be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day by the county.

Of the 124 husbands complained against by their wives, there have been all classes and manner of men. Lawyers, physicians and professional men and men from every walk of life are included in the number.

What strikes the authorities strangely is the fact that not one of the men have been sent to the rockpile to work for the county for the support of their wives and children. The records show that more than half the men have paid up and were allowed to go free. Several were placed on probation and as far as is shown by the records, have paid specified amounts to their spouses since their arraignment. A few complaints were withdrawn after husband and wife reached an agreement.

Some of the actions were brought by wives desiring divorces. Conviction of a husband for non-support, while not in itself grounds for divorce, usually carries weight with the court.

Prosecutors are delighted with the success of the new law.

PREPARING TO BUILD ELECTRIC ROAD

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.)
Pendleton, Or., Aug. 7.—To negotiate with settlers on irrigated lands near Hermiston, A. A. Cole, secretary of the newly organized farmers' trolley line, is in the west end of the Umatilla valley working along the line of survey, making preliminary arrangements for right of way.

Settlers have indicated a willingness to assist the railroad by donating right of way and subscribing for capital stock if needed, but as the work has been only preliminary no deeds have been taken. Mr. Cole will determine on this trip something of the cost of land from Pendleton to Holdman, and especially of terminal ground at Umatilla. The line is surveyed across the Umatilla irrigation project, with depot site not far from the big reservoir, and on into the rich farming country near Holdman.

The plans now are to use steam on the line until an immense power plant can be constructed on the Umatilla river. C. A. Hill, of Holdman, is president of the new company, and A. A. Cole of Pendleton, is secretary.
