BALLINGER PUTS HIMSELF AGAINST HIS OWN RECORD

Washington, Aug. 18.—Another reversal by Secretary Ballinger, of his own previous interpretation, it is charged here, has been found.
Garfield, when secretary of the interior, on February 15, 1909, decided that persons who make homestead entries on lands within reclamation projects might after proof of five years residence and cultivation receive certificate of such proof, which would enable them to sell part or all of their land notwithstanding the fact that they actually reclaimed half and had not made all payments required by law. They would have been allowed to make proof within the five years but were allowed twice that time to make all payments. The ruling was in favor of the poorer entrymen who might thus procure money with which to improve their remaining lands, also it would enable entrymen, before five years residence, to have their claims and work elsewhere if necessary to get money with which to develop their lands.

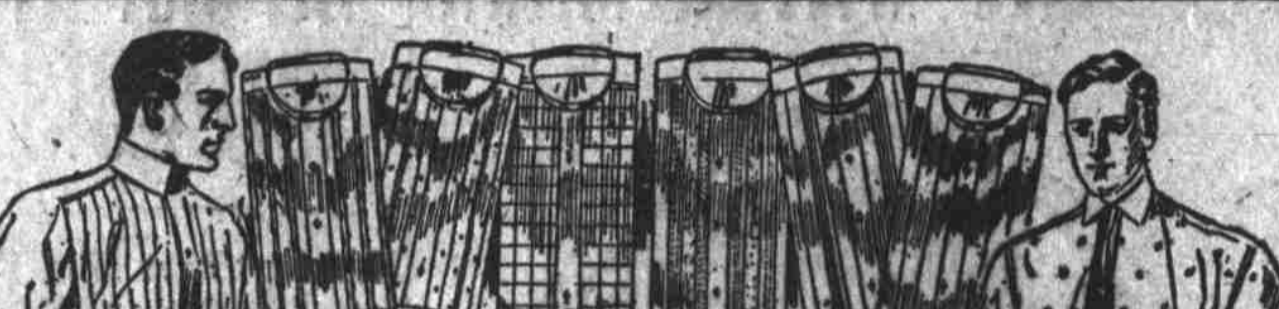
