THE HIPPODROME, JR.--THE RINGMASTER AND THE ELEPHANT

SOMETHING NEW AND FINE

MY DEAR CHILDREN! This is the first of a set of "Hippodrome Figures" to appear each Sunday. By collecting and saving these figures you will have a full-size "Hippodrome," an ideal toy--just the thing for after-supper amusement. A pleasing effect is to be had by sprinkling a ring of sawdust upon the table and causing your animals to act in the center as if in a circus ring.

DIRECTIONS:

Paste this sheet upon a sheet of heavy cardboard; cut out the parts of figures around the heavy lines; join the parts together by piercing white dots and knitting a piece of string on either side, as in diagram No. 1. A to a, B to b, C to c, D to d, E to e, F to f, G to g. Join the parts in the numbers of which they are marked 1, 2 and 3, having 1 on top, 2 in the center and 3 at the bottom.

Be sure and have the knots tied tightly, so the parts will not slip or slide. Another way to join the parts is to insert a pin through the holes from the front, then through a small cork in the back, bending the point of the pin after it projects through the cork. Now bend the legs of your figures slightly apart and stand them up. By moving the arms and legs of both figures into different positions many amusing and pleasing effects may be had.
