London, Aug. 27.—R. L. Borden, op-position leader in the dominion house of commons, sailed for home today, af-ter a two months vacation in Europe.

New York, Aug. 27.—The national committee of the United Irish League of America met at the Hoffman house today to discuss matters of importance in connection with the present work for the Irish enveragence. for the Irish government.

Oshkosh, Wis., Aug. 27.—The German Press association of Wisconsin began its annual meeting here today with a good attendance. The proceedings will continue over Saturday and Sunday.
