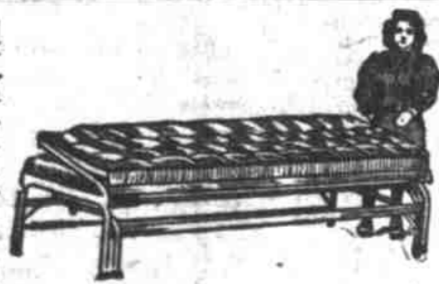

**BUILD BIG PLANT ON DESCHUTES**

Official of Northwestern Corporation Says Many Projects Are Planned.

Walla Walla, Wash., Sept. 11.—Little information can be gained from General Manager Welsh of the Northwestern corporation regarding the detailed plans of that company after having floated a loan of \$1,000,000 from the Germania Trust company of Philadelphia. Beyond saying that in a gen-

eral way the company would extend its traction lines and improve everywhere. Mr. Welsh would make few definite statements. Until spring, however, he said no new work would be taken up, but all improvements now under way would be finished.

The Deschutes river project, which includes the building of a hundred thousand horsepower plant, was the only big proposition he would discuss, and this, he said, would be pushed through. The power will be used for lighting and traction purposes, mainly, he intimated, for the latter. In all 13 cities under the corporation combine, improvements will be made and substantial extensions of lines will be seen in most of them.

Improvements Planned.

Mr. Welsh intimated that many miles of road would be built from Walla Walla in the spring of 1910, also that other projected electric roads in this field would be built, although he could not be brought to make a direct statement. The \$100,000 subscription under construction here is taken to indicate that there will be much activity around Walla Walla in spring.

Several other companies have an-

nounced their intentions to build, and lately the Washington Traction company floated a \$1,000,000 loan in London. It is said there will be a lively war and that the northwestern corporation, the pioneer company in the field and now in control, will make a desperate effort to keep out competitors.

The head offices of the northwestern corporation will remain in Portland, Walla Walla will be the company's headquarters for the state of Washington, but in general the company's operations will be carried on from Portland, according to Mr. Welsh.
