WATER IN FUEL OIL
Steamer Laurine Delayed Several Hours on Run.

Because of water which was mixed with the fuel in her tanks the steamer Laurine was three hours late in getting out of here yesterday on her trip to Astoria. She took oil water and the time she was a few miles below Goble she could hardly make steam.

Water gets into the tanks along with the oil and sometimes when a steamer takes on a supply of fuel, she gets a great deal of the water to and the result is that she cannot steam when this mixture is in her tanks. That was what happened to the Laurine when she went to the tanks Tuesday to oil up. She got mostly water and, when she had gone a few miles beyond Goble she could hardly make steam enough to run on.
