SUPPLIED WITH GAS
The Portland Gas company has now
25,000 feet of mains in St. Johns. This
is greatly in excess of its franchise
requirements and shows the evident
intentions of the company to carry out

now laid from the holder, on Albina
avenue, along Willis boulevard, to St.
Johns avenue; on St. Johns avenue from
Willis boulevard to Hayes street; on

are laid on every other street inside
of this loop, making a network of pipe
over six miles in length. The laying
of the pipes cost the company between
\$40,000 and \$50,000.

E. P. SCHWERIN COMES INTO CAMP!

San Francisco "Call," Oct. 10, 1909—"Without any beating of tom-toms
or burning of red fires and with the unostentatiousness of a church mouse, E. P.
Schwerin, vice president and general manager of the Pacific Mail Co., has
joined step in the march of progress and has given orders for the installa-
tion of a wireless plant on the liner "Korona," which arrived here yester-
day. When the big steamship sails again she will be endowed with the
power of speech. When E. P. Schwerin returned recently from Honolulu he
reproduced an alleged interview in which he was quoted as belittling the
value of wireless, but at the same time declared that his ships would not be
equipped until certain great improvements had been made in the science of
wireless telegraphy. The wireless telegraphy of that day and this are prac-
tically the same, but for some reason unexplained, Schwerin has changed
his mind.
The "Korona" is to be equipped with a 5-kilowatt sending apparatus,
which is the most powerful installed on any ship on the Pacific. The in-
stallation will be made by the United Wireless Company, and the
ships on the China run will be similarly equipped as they come to port.—etc.
