SUES FOR \$5500; FINDINGS FOR \$600

Circuit Judge Gantenben yesterday decided the case of Sol Levi against G. A. Hagar in favor of the plaintiff for \$600. The testimony was heard in the morning without a jury. Levi sued for \$5500 damages for failure of the defendant to give possession of the leased property in Vancouver, Wash., under a lease for three years, with the privilege of renewal. The property under the lease included a complete moving picture show, and Levi said that Hagar told him he was making \$250 per month net on the show.
