COOS BAY CITIZEN PARTIALLY PLUCKED BY A CLAIRVOYANT

San Francisco, Nov. 30.—A conspiracy was laid bare here today in which James O'Kelly, a wealthy tobacconist of Coos Bay, figured as the dupe of a so-called clairvoyant, "Dr." Astro, alias Alexander.

Through the aid of a woman, claiming to be his wife, but who was known as Stella Mason, or Tynan, once an actress, Astro is alleged to have attempted to fleece O'Kelly of \$1000 by pretending to him that the Mason woman was his long lost daughter, for whom he has been searching.

When O'Kelly's wife died recently her last wish was that her husband find the missing daughter of her first marriage and give to her \$5000 besides her valuable trousseau.

In searching for the missing girl, O'Kelly came here and met "Dr." Astro, Clairvoyant, who promised to produce

the missing girl through the aid of his mysterious power. On Saturday, Astro brought forth from the land of the great unknown the information that the missing child would be found at the Malta apartments in this city.

O'Kelly proceeded to that place and found a girl who wept copiously on his shoulder and convinced O'Kelly that she was the person he was looking for, by producing a photograph of her dead mother. This photograph, the police claim, was stolen by the clairvoyant from O'Kelly.

When shown the photograph, O'Kelly turned over part of the \$5000. He was to hand her the remaining part yesterday, but when he went back to the Malta apartments his suspicions were aroused by the fact that the girl was missing.

He reported the case to the police.

San Francisco, Nov. 30.—After a desperate midnight struggle in the Lacey saloon in Market street, during which several shots were fired, a safecracker giving his name as James Rogers, is a prisoner at the city jail today.

Patrolman E. Murphy discovered the man kneeling before the saloon safe, working by the light of a lantern. Several other officers, Murphy entered the room.

Immediately the robber extinguished the light and grappled with the first bluecoat he could reach. For more than 10 minutes the men struggled in the darkness. Rogers was finally overpowered and taken to the station. A search of a room at an address he gave the police revealed a complete set of burglar's tools.

When the man was searched at the police station several letters addressed to John Bennett Rogers, 1123 First avenue, Seattle, were found in his pockets. There were also two checks on the Puget Sound bank for \$15,000 and \$10,000 respectively, drawn in Rogers' favor. In another pocket were letters from Rogers' wife, bearing Berlin postmarks, and a life insurance policy payable to her.

When questioned the man refused to account for the presence of the miscellaneous collection of property that was found. The police declared their belief that he had robbed Rogers in Seattle and the police of that city were notified of his capture.

WITNESS GONE, MAN SECURES FREEDOM

Because the prosecuting witness in the case has gone to Germany, and also because the municipal court, which convicted him, had no jurisdiction to try him, Frank Martin was ordered discharged from the county jail by Presiding Judge Bronrough in the circuit court this morning.

Martin was sentenced to 180 days by Municipal Judge Bennett for pointing a gun at Jacob Kober, who has since gone to Germany. Martin was taken to the rock pile, but later returned to the county jail to act as a trustee. He has served about 60 days of his time.

Deputy District Attorney Page this morning said that the municipal court had no jurisdiction to try the case, and he was further unprepared by the absence of his witness. Martin was forthwith given his liberty.
