

# GUINNESS MURDER CONFESSION BY RAY LAMPHERE

## St. Louis Paper Prints Story Alleged to Have Been Told by Noted Murderess' Hired Man—Fire Set by Accident.

(Special From St. Louis.)  
St. Louis, Mo., Jan. 13.—That Mrs. Belle Guinness, alleged perpetrator of the Guinness "murder farm" horrors, was chloroformed and killed with her three children by Ray Lamphere is the startling assertion made in a copyrighted article published today in the St. Louis Post-Dispatch.

The story is based upon a confession said to have been made by Ray Lamphere, who recently died in the Indiana penitentiary. The confession was made to a man whose name is withheld, but whose character and truthfulness the article declares are beyond question. The confession is said to have been written by Lamphere, although no copy of it was found among his effects after his death at the prison.

The confession in substance is as follows:  
Mrs. Guinness and her children were chloroformed by Ray Lamphere who was robbing the house, to which he set fire, burning them to death. Jennie Olsen was not murdered by Mrs. Guinness, as was supposed, but was chloroformed and burned with the rest. The chloroform used was part of that purchased by Lamphere for Mrs. Guinness. She used some of it to kill three men killed and assisted in burying all three. The three men killed were Andrew Hegelin, and probably Ole Eudberg and Tonnes Petersen Lien. One of these men, possibly Lien, was Mrs. Guinness' husband.

This confession of Lamphere, it is stated, is not the confession he was reported to have made to the Rev. A. E. Schell of Mount Pleasant, Iowa. The article asserts, however, that the facts, according to the man who supplied the details, are the same as those in the confession made to Schell, which the minister could confirm if he chose.

# INDIAN TYPE IN "MAN FROM HOME" Ghost of Daniel Vorhees Re- calls Days Before the War.

If the grand old war senator from Indiana, Daniel Vorhees, were to come back from the great unknown and drop in for an evening's entertainment by "The Man From Home" at the Portland theatre he would doubtless wonder if he were dreaming or if the Daniel Vorhees who is the play, as played by Henry Hall, were not an incarnation of himself in his younger days.

When approached on the question of portraying and asked if people actually talked that way in Indiana, Mr. Hall took it rather seriously. "I have had on my mind for some time. ## NEW SCHEDULE MAY REDUCE TIME

By sending a fast mail train out of Portland at 7 p. m., the Oregon Railroad & Navigation company will probably be able to considerably shorten the time between Portland and Chicago. The new train will go into service next Sunday to be known as No. 10, under the new schedule prepared by William McMurray, general passenger agent of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation and Southern Pacific lines in Oregon, and returned from Chicago approved.

Another important feature in connection with the inauguration of the new schedule is the fact that the service between Portland and The Dalles will be much improved, in that it will have two local runs, one leaving at 3:30 or 4 p. m., and the other being part of the fast mail leaving at 7. This train will carry enough coaches to accommodate the traffic as far as Umatilla, and stops will be made all along the line wherever required.

The new schedule calls for the discontinuation of train No. 10, known as the Salt Lake Express, which leaves this city at 8 p. m. and arrives at 8:40 a. m., but this, it is held, will not affect the service as that traffic is being cared for by the other features.

# TURJON SCARES NURSES AT ST. VINCENT HOSPITAL

## Taken to City Jail Where He Is Booked on Charge of Drunk- enness—Released at Re- quest of Jack Smith.

Louis Turjon, alias Philippe Jacob, who has a record for \$25,000 against the Crystal Springs sanitarium, in which he alleged cruelty and brutal treatment, brought about an investigation of the institution by the county grand jury, was arrested at St. Vincent's hospital. Attendants at the hospital told Sergeant Riley and Patrolman Long, who made the arrest, that the man was insane. His actions greatly alarmed the nurses at the institution.

This morning "Jack" Smith, who has long been intimate with Turjon, went to Captain Glover, at police headquarters, and told him his friend was only drunk. He promised to take care of him if the police would give Turjon his freedom. Captain Glover, not knowing the history of the man's career in Portland, as he was arrested under the name of Jacob, signed an order for his release. Smith then took Turjon, or Jacob, to 787 Davis street, leaving him alone.

Given Raw Alcohol.  
Turjon grew frantic after a time, frightening Mrs. Clymate into giving him a drink of raw alcohol, diluted with water. She says he usually drinks nothing but alcohol diluted thus. Mrs. Clymate telephoned again to the police, but before their arrival, Turjon left the house and went to the home of Mrs. B. C. Henzlee, 1944 Thirteenth street, where he gained entrance to the house. Mrs. Henzlee telephoned for the police and Smith, who was accompanying the former inmate of the sanitarium, took him away.

Up to a late hour this afternoon the police had not captured Turjon. Originally, the man was known as Philippe Jacob. Some time later, while living at Sitka, Alaska, he changed his name to Louis Turjon. Early in June, 1908, Turjon was examined as to his sanity by the United States authorities in Sitka, and committed to the Crystal Springs sanitarium, the proprietor of which, Dr. R. L. Gillespie, has a contract with the government for the care of insane patients.

Drink Causes Discharge.  
Turjon was kept in the sanitarium until January, 1909, when he was discharged and pronounced cured. After his release, he got a job as orderly at St. Vincent's hospital under the name of Jacob. Because of drinking, he was compelled to leave there in December of last year. In the meantime, however, and toward the latter part of June, 1909, Jacob filed suit in circuit court for \$25,000 damages against the Crystal Springs Sanitarium company, charging sensational allegations of brutal treatment and cruelty, and interested persons caused an investigation, which caused a great sensation, to be made of the sanitarium. The grand jury returned a not true bill, refusing to indict the company of the sanitarium on Turjon's testimony. Other testimony was favorable to the asylum.

# MAN DROPS DEAD; FROZEN IN ICE

When Charles Malluer, 55 years old, living near the Lake View hotel on the Linton road, went to feed his chickens this morning he slipped on the ice around a water hydrant and was found dead with the water pouring into his face. Indications are that he fell with his head up and soon expired.

# INJUNCTION PUT ON PEDDLERS' TAX

## Moses Krawes and Two Dozen Associates Challenge Right of City to Collect.

Closely following the vehicle tax suit, challenging the right of the city to collect revenue under the ordinance recently passed, another source of city license revenue was hit today by an injunction to restrain the collection of peddlers' tax under the ordinance approved on November 27.

A broadside attack is made upon the validity of this license. It is charged that the fees are discriminatory, because they do not apply to the whole city, because they do not apply to newsboys, and do not apply to those who pay \$20 per day as "first class hawkers" under another ordinance. It is also pointed out that another law fixes various sums for peddlers of different degrees, at variance with the \$500 per annum fee enacted by the November ordinance.
