

LEBANON JOINS
BOOSTERS' BRIGADE

Thriving Town Raises Publicity Fund of \$3500 to Make Things Hum.

There is not a vacant house in Lebanon, according to Senator M. A. Miller, who is in Portland from the thriving valley town. Not only are there no vacant houses, but new houses are being built, a dozen of them, despite the winter weather.

"Lebanon will soon be on the main line of the Southern Pacific," said Senator Miller. "The town has raised a publicity fund of \$3500 and is spending it judiciously in spreading the fame of one of nature's garden spots. Good status has been secured from advertising. Many families have come among us to assist in development, and none of them would change locations—they are positive about that."

Building \$40,000 School.
"Lebanon is building a \$40,000 high school on a 10 acre campus, the finest site for a school in Oregon. I know that sounds pretty strong, but we believe it is literally true. The city council has voted the construction of a modern city hall, and work will begin as soon as the sun begins to shine regularly."

"The flour mill which was burned will be rebuilt this summer, overcoming the loss that the town has sustained during its absence. Plans have been perfected for a four story brick hotel, to fill a need which has been felt by Lebanon for a year or two."

County Has 35,000.
"Linn county is half as large as the state of Connecticut. The New England state has over 1,000,000 people, while Linn county has but 35,000. We are going after the other 465,000, or as many as we can get. We cannot get cheap advertising through the clubs or old maid societies, but we do get energetic homebuilders the chance of their lives to grasp opportunity and secure location and climate unsurpassed anywhere."

"Prospects were never so bright for Lebanon and Linn county."

OREGON CITY DEBATERS

TO ALAMEDA PARK
