

NEW STEAMER MAY BE ORDERED FOR TILLAMOOK RUN

Growing Business Makes It Necessary for Portland-Tillamook Line to Plan a New and Larger Boat.

Lack of ability to handle all of the freight of the Portland & Tillamook Transportation company may be the cause of the steamer Golden Gate being supplemented by a new and larger steamer, which the company is contemplating building.

This information was received this morning from an authoritative source, and although the matter has not been definitely decided upon it is thought that there is no question but what it will become an accomplished fact in the near future.

The Journal's informant, who is a member of the company operating the Golden Gate, said this morning that if it is decided definitely to build a new steamer for the Portland-Tillamook run it will be a vessel of about the same size as the steamer Argo, which was wrecked on the Tillamook bar last fall, and if possible it will be constructed here.

In case the company builds the steamer the Golden Gate will still be retained and either kept on the present run, alternating with the new steamer, or a place found for her on some other run where a light draft vessel could go to advantage.

The freight traffic on the Portland-Tillamook run has increased to such an extent lately that the possibility of a new steamer to help take care of it has been impressed on the Portland & Tillamook Transportation company.
