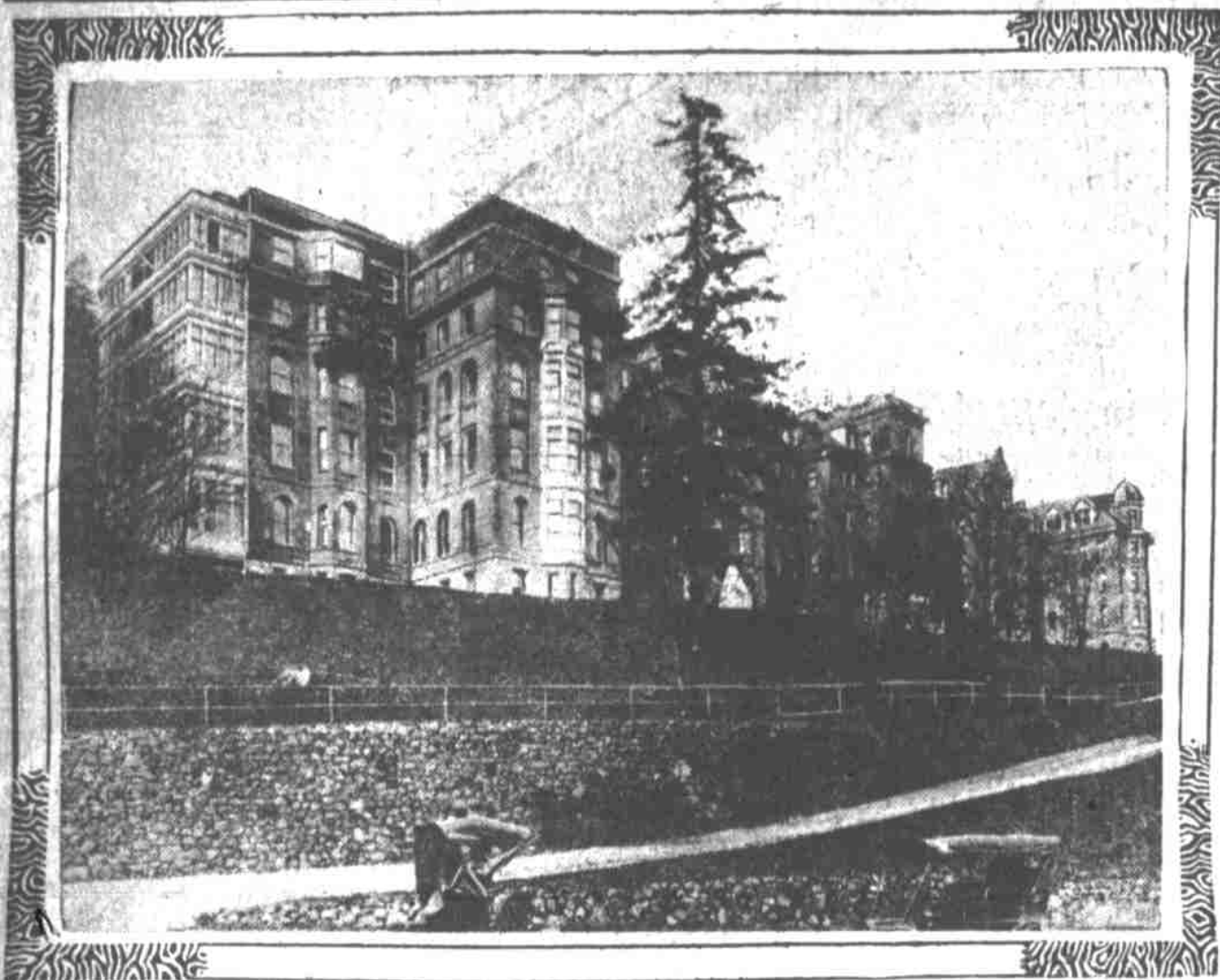


St. Vincent's Hospital Annex Practically Completed

Representing an investment of \$150,000, the six-story annex to St. Vincent's hospital is practically completed. Within the next 30 days the annex will be finished and ready for receiving patients. The building is a fireproof structure and is pronounced to be one of the most perfectly equipped institutions for the treatment of the sick and injured anywhere in the country.

While suffering materially in its interior arrangement and construction from the older portion of the hospital, the exterior conforms exactly to the design of the original building.

Surgical Work on Sixth.
The sixth floor is given over entirely to surgical work and when completed will contain every known modern equipment necessary to successful surgery. Wherever feasible tiling has been used in the floors. Tiling was used throughout the surgery and all of the corridors have tile floors.

The lower floor will be given up almost entirely to offices and administration purposes. The four floors between the first and sixth will constitute the

hospital, or ward portion, of the structure. Here in place of the long wards filled with cot beds, is found a large number of small wards and private rooms, each of the wards being large enough to accommodate two or three beds.

Private Baths Provided.

Several of the private rooms on each floor are provided with private baths. Throughout the annex the walls are finished in a hard cement plaster, highly polished and painted white, giving almost a perfect wall sanitation.

Features of the annex are the superior ventilating system and the provision for the maximum of sunlight in the wards and in the galleries for convalescents.

Each floor is connected with the kitchen in the basement by means of dumb waiters. In the basement is a private heat, power and light plant sufficient for the requirements of the entire hospital.

APARTMENTS WILL COST \$10,000 EACH

Portland Investors Show by Purchases They Have Faith in Platting Tracts.

Close in acreage was in more active demand last week than in any like period in several months. While no very large deals were made, there were a number of small sales, and in each case the figures indicate the esteem in which platting tracts are held by Portland investors.

William Von Glan has sold to J. J. Johnston 2 1/2 acres in the Witten D. L. C. for \$7,000.

Five acres in section 13, township 1 south, range 1 east, was purchased by L. M. Goe from L. W. Darling for \$8,250. An 8 1/2 acre tract in section 26, township 1 south, range 2 east, was sold by Fred H. Lord to A. F. Knapp for \$500 an acre.

E. O. Ekstrom has purchased from William Lundelson a tract of land in section 20, township 1 south, range 2 east, for \$4,000. A tract of acreage 20x66 rods in section 7, township 1 south, range 1 east, has been purchased by B. M. Lombard from C. B. Woodworth for \$6,000. This tract is located in the district between Irvington and Rose City Park.

Twenty acres in section 16, township 1 south, range 2 east, and 61 acres in section 9 of the same township, both tracts fronting the Powell Valley road have been purchased by John Gauten from Ernest Schwedler for \$10,000. Cann, Heilborn and McHildebrand report the sale of several acre tracts during the past week in their tract at Applegate.

FILE PLANS FOR OLD PEOPLE'S HOME BLDG.

Plans and specifications for the old People's home building, to be erected on the east side, near Laurelhurst Park, have been filed in the office of the city building inspector. The structure will be a four-story brick. Its ground floor dimensions will be 150x100. Lazarus, Whitehouse & Foulhoux are the architects. The estimated cost of the building is \$150,000.
