

DAMNING EVIDENCE MASSES AGAINST MURDERER GOHL

Sailor Slayer Will Have to Face Charges of 30 or 40 Killings, Say Detectives at Aberdeen, Washington

(Special Dispatch to The Journal)
Aberdeen, Wash., April 6.—The rumor early this morning to the effect that Hoffman's body had been found proved false. Men are still dredging for the body. It is the intention to use a diver at low tide. The confession of Klingenberg is resulting in a chain of evidences being formed that will implicate others and may result in the conviction of a number of men for other murders.

Klingenberg is prey of remorse.
