

# DECREE TO WIFE BUT NOT CHILDREN

## Mrs. Mary Andrews is Freed From Husband Who is Given Children.

Accused of making dates with the minister when she wanted to go to church, and humiliated beyond endurance by his charges against her, Mrs. Mary Andrews told her story of unhappiness in the divorce court this morning, and said she could not live longer with J. H. Andrews.

Mrs. Andrews, who home is at Creston, said her husband has a violent temper and began to fuss at her five days after they were married. He wanted all the privileges himself, she said, and became angry when she went downtown. He was not a regular booze fighter, she said, but sometimes he would be "fanny."

Andrews was allowed to retain the custody of their two children, who are in the care of another family. Mrs. Andrews has the right to visit them at all proper hours. They were married in Portland in September, 1908.

Judge Morrow, who heard the four default divorce cases tried this morning, took the case of Laura L. Magoon against Byron G. Magoon under advisement because he was not certain the corroborating testimony would support a decree on the ground of cruelty. Mrs. Magoon, whose husband is proprietor of a piano house at Pendleton, said he struck her several times, furnished little money for her support, and made false charges against her. She asked to

Potatoes with iron handles are the latest wonders produced by the soil of Oregon. A specimen of this freak crop was brought to the Chamber of Commerce permanent exhibit room in the Commer-

Colonel Miller, who has charge of the exhibit, thinks a great deal of the new acquisition to his display and believes it opens up a new field of endeavor.

"Potatoes with handles!" he exclaimed. "Just think of it! What a fine thing it will be to go into the neighboring store and get a few spuds, pick them up by the handles and carry them home without fear of the paper bag going to pieces." This handle in this case consists of an iron ring about three inches in

diameter, around one end of which the potato has grown. The ring can be swung back and forth without injury to the skin of the potato.

The chamber is anxious to get rare specimens of all kinds of products of the soil, now that it has an expert at work putting them up for the exhibit.
