SURPRISE WORLD

Horticultural Board President Returns From Trip With **Encouraging News.**

W. K. Neweil, of Gaston, Or., presi-dent of the state board of herticulreturning yesterday from a week's trip over eastern Oregon, predicted a year of great prosperity for Oregon fruit-growers, with prices ranging good, steady demand and sufficient supply. Mr. Newell said that in all parts of astern Oregon that he visited, he found promises of a better crop of fruits than ever before in the history of the state. reported prospects excellent and said the growers everywhere are exceptionally well satisfied with conditions

"We are now marketing," he declared, "the finest strawberry crop in the state's history. Not only is the crop better and larger, but the grade of the fruit is noticeably improved, and the proces are higher. All berry crops will be in excess of those of past years, and prices probably will be higher.

"We expect some shortage in the cherry crop, but it will not be so great as to be serious and affect the market perceptibly. Pears, too, will not be as numerous as last year, but there will be no serious shortage. The cold weather of the early spring tended to slightly injure the cherries and pears.

"Without question," the apple crop will be the largest in the history of the state, and the products will be h better in quality. I have not yet visited the western and far southern districts, but there is no doubt that the grop will exceed and excel those of former years. Prices will be good, too,

The prune crop in western Oregon will not be as large as that of last, year, but the eastern Oregon crop will be much better. Prices which will be offered for prunes will be excellent, for the reason that the California crop will be extremely small. Oregon probably will be the only state to produce a normal prune crop.

"Apple prices will be better than last year. The late storm in the Mis-sissippi valley, and in the far eastern apple growing districts, injured the crops so hadly that I doubt if there will be enough of the fruit to supply the demand, although the Oregon crop will be unusually large. Oregon may surprise the world this year with its crop of grapes. So far the vines have done splendidly, and there is now little danger but that Oregon will harvest a surprisingly large quantity of grapes. Many More Orchards.

"Amazing to me is the additional acreage devoted to grapes this year. Many growers are enlarging their fields. Most noticeable to me on my trip into eastern Oregon was the rap-idity with which the country is being developed. acceptance new land is being cleared and 'orchardized,' and the being cleared and 'orchardized,' and the farming. If anything, is becoming more intensified. Modern methods are being everywhere adopted by the fruit-grow-ers, and this is one reason I give for the excellent quality of produce. Pests are scarce and I do not believe it will be necessary to condemn but little fruit this summer and fall."

Mr. Newell visited Milton, Or., Friday, during the strawberry fesival in that town. He said more than 5000 visitors participated in the celebration, and many excellent addresses were made. Mr. Newell will go to every re-gion of the state, studying the fruit ituation and instructing inspectors.
