

CELEBRATE TIETON PROJECT OPENING

First Unit of Big Irrigation Scheme Completed; Quench Thirst of 11,000 Acres.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) North Yakima, Wash., June 8.—By a celebration to be held Wednesday, June 8, North Yakima will recognize the completion of the first unit of the Tieton irrigation project, built by the reclamation service of the United States to water 25,000 acres. The first unit will water 11,000 acres, the second unit 8,000, and the third unit 15,000.

The system consists of the Bumping Lake dam, the main ditch and the distribution system. The main ditch takes the water from the Tieton river to the Tieton land. The Bumping lake dam catches water to give back to the Naches river the water taken from its tributary, the Tieton.

Construction of the canal began in 1907. The ditch was completed in 1909. Work on the main laterals and distribution system was commenced in 1909 and has been completed in 1910.

In building the ditch 200,000 cubic yards of earth and rock were excavated and six tunnels driven. In the distribution system 15 miles of main laterals and 60 miles of sublaterals were constructed, and 24 miles of cement pipe were laid.

North Yakima, Wash., June 8.—By the High Line irrigation project proposed in Kittitas, Yakima, and Benton counties by the valleys of the Yakima Water Users' association, 300,000 acres of land can be reclaimed at a cost of \$15,000,000, according to the report presented at a meeting of the trustees of the association in Tappanish by Chief Engineer Christian Anderson. This is the outside figure. Enthusiasm is such that there appears to be no doubt that the project will be undertaken and completed.

IS STEAMER'S DECK AMERICAN SOIL?

(United Press Leased Wire.) Olympia, Wash., June 8.—Is the deck of a steamship on a San Francisco-Portland run American soil? That is a question the supreme court will have to decide. If the answer is "yes," the Continental Casualty company will have to pay O. L. Lewis of Seattle the insurance on the life of his wife, who was killed on a steamer en route from San Francisco north.

The company refused to pay the policy on the ground that it expressly stipulated it would only cover the policy holder on United States soil. The tragedy occurred at sea three miles from shore. The case comes to the supreme court on an appeal from King county.

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GIRLS ARRESTED AT THE RINGSIDE

In Male Attire They Attend Prizefight, But Shrewd Policeman Stops Them.

Los Angeles, June 8.—In Tropic, a suburb of Los Angeles, are two attractive young women who are recovering from a series of adventures, all crowded into the space of a few hours, which they declared fulfilled all their expectations when they started for Los Angeles last evening.

The girls are Myrtle Thompson and Ethel Fisher. They attended a real prizefight and were arrested and taken to a police station and released all so quickly that they actually did not have time to think until it was all over. Determined to see one of the fights their brothers had often discussed, the girls gathered complete outfits of men's clothing, came to Los Angeles and engaged a room in a hotel. Here they clad themselves in the masculine garments and made ready to go to the Conley-Moran fight.

Realizing that it wouldn't be safe to go to the fight without escorts, they rang for two messenger boys to escort them. The "young men" sat near the ring in the full glare of the great calcium lights. None but Patrolman Henderson, who happened to sit behind them, discovered their secret.

When the girls left the pavilion Patrolman Henderson spoke quietly to them and after a terrified gasp they accompanied him to a car and rode to the police station. The story of the adventure was then told to the officers, and after Lieutenant Haupt had given them a little fatherly advice they were sent to their homes in care of an officer. They promised they would never attend another fight.

BEND MAN JUMPS FROM BUGGY; FATALLY HURT

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Bend, Or., June 8.—Emil Erickson was fatally injured Monday afternoon when the team of horses he was driving ran away. Erickson jumped from the buggy and was thrown on a pile of rocks. Oliver Johnson and Erickson drove into the timber yesterday to inspect a claim which Johnson owns. While returning, the neck yoke slipped from the wagon tongue and the tongue dropped to the ground. The team became unmanageable.

Erickson leaped from the buggy, but his foot slipped on the step and he was thrown to one side. The back and side of his head struck on the rock. The skull was fractured in three places, the most serious being at the base of the brain. It is not expected he can live more than a few hours.

Erickson came here several years ago from Bemidji, Minn., and has considerable property besides timber. Johnson remained in the buggy when the team ran away, stopped the horses and escaped injury.

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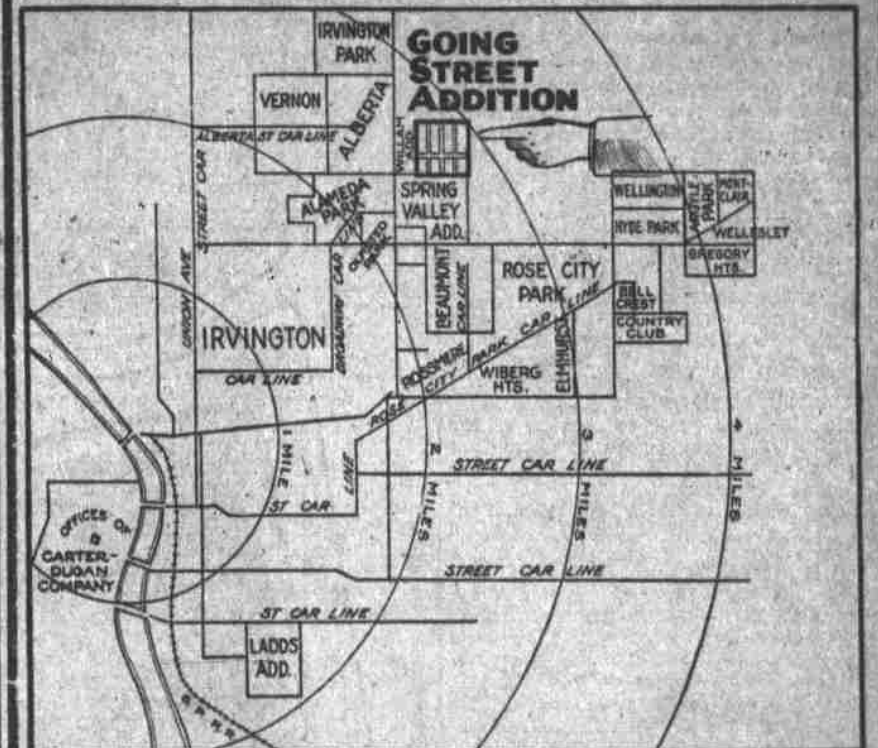
