LARGEST LUMBER CARGO.

British Steamer Knight of the Garter Sails With Record Load. Carrying the largest cargo of lum-ber that ever cleared from any port or the Pacific coast. The British steam

er Knight of the Garter, Captain Finnis, left down at 8 o'clock this morning on her voyage to China. She cleared at the custom house with 4,500,000 feet of Oregon fir for Tsingtau for orders. The total value of the cargo is \$59,046.

After leaving the Columbia river the Knight of the Garter will go to Nanalmo to bunker and will then proceed on her voyage across the Pacific. While there have been several large cargoes set afloat at this port, there has never been one before to equal that of the Knight of the Garter. 




