

### GAEKWAR ARRIVES AT SAN FRANCISCO

Worth Untold Millions; Looks as if Four Bits Would Help Some.

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, June 17.—Without the jeweled turban, flowing robes and ropes of pearls in which he has been familiarly pictured, but attired in dingy Prince Albert, unpolished shoes and a straw hat, and needing a hair cut, his highness the Gaeckwar of Baroda arrived in San Francisco today. The potentate was a passenger on the Pacific Mail liner Siberia, accompanied by his wife, the Maharani, his daughter, the Princess Indarajda, an aide de camp and a retinue of servants, English and Hindu.

toed millions in jewels, gold and lands, ruler over 2,000,000 people, with power of life and death over them, is a very democratic, suave gentleman of 53. On the voyage he mingled with the passengers and played whist incessantly. The Maharani is a beautiful young woman, very retiring, and affects the native costume. The prince is ruler of the state of Baroda, whose border is within eight hours' ride of Bombay. It has an area of 8000 square miles, and is one of the richest provinces in India.

### "IKE" HARROLD STILL SAFE IN LAKE JAIL

Cooler judgment seems to have prevailed, and there is a noticeable relaxation of public feeling. Sheriff Albert Dent and his deputies are still heavily armed and alert, but all danger is believed past. Harrold has not had his preliminary hearing. CABRERA'S SON DYING; ATTEMPTS SUICIDE (United Press Leased Wire.) New Orleans, June 17.—Estrada Cabrera, son of President Cabrera of Guatemala, is dying at a hotel here from tuberculosis. He is also suffering from shock following his recent attempts to commit suicide. His father is being kept advised of his condition. When young Cabrera arrived in New York from Europe, on route to Central America, he was taken aboard a special train and brought here. He arrived too weak to go aboard his steamer bound for home. Cabrera attempted suicide on a train in France and again aboard an ocean liner bound for New York and is reported to have again tried to end his life aboard the train between here and New York. His mother died recently at Nice.
