

GOVERNMENT BY PEOPLE OPPOSED BY R. R. DUNLWAY

Obstructionist Who Is Fighting Proposed Broadway Bridge Boldly Declares Voters Do Not Know What They Want.

"The Broadway bridge is but an incident," said Ralph R. Dunlway, yesterday. "I am opposed to a pure democracy, wherefore my fight against the bridge."

Dunlway, who is counsel for Frank Kiernan in the obstructionist suit against the Broadway bridge, explained his surprising assertion. He added other surprising assertions to the first, so that during an hour's conversation he told more about his plans and purposes than he ever made clear before the four judges of the circuit court who named his cause moot.

Bridge an Incident. "As I said, the bridge is but an incident. The governmental idea is the essential thing. In this suit I am going to win or be defeated, but whatever the end, I shall establish a precedent. Then, in the future, when I carry similar issues into the courts, I shall know what to do."

Former Governor Frank Brown of Maryland has formally announced that he would be a candidate for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination next year.

Mayor Simon says the bonds may be sold by public subscription. In this he is prepared to meet the letter and evade the spirit of the law, which requires that bonds be sold to one buyer after advertisement. But \$250,000 is but a drop in the bucket. Such a sum will provide only for a beginning.

Attorney Dunlway meant that he would use the injunction against the mayor. He also said the thing which influences his client Kiernan, most is the desire to keep the city's business south of the railroad bridge.

"I am accused of being hired by the O. R. & N. Co.," said Dunlway. "I am not, but I only wish I were. We believe that Portland is here because of the river and the railroads. We believe that the construction of a new bridge would push the harbor north and with it the business."

VALE WILL GET 2 NEW DEPOTS

Franchise Granted to Railroads and Many Improvements Promised.

Vale, Or., June 21.—The granting of the franchise to the Oregon & Eastern and Malheur Valley railroads yesterday by the city council, giving permanent railroad yards in this city, assures depot building within a few days. According to Attorney Thompson of Salt Lake City, who was here to represent the railroad company, work on the big freight depot will begin this week, while the \$20,000 brick passenger station will be completed before winter.

DEFENSE IN BROWNE BRIBERY CASE OPENS

Chicago, June 20.—The defense in the trial of Lee O'Neill Browne, charged with bribery in connection with the election of William Lorimer to the United States senate, began today. The court overruled the motion of the defense to instruct the jury to acquit on the ground that the state's case was not proven.

George Doyle and William Russell, the latter a "labor lobbyist," were witnesses during the morning. They testified that after Lorimer's election Representative White said he had a good thing coming and would make the people come through.
