

2 POLICEMEN FACE SERIOUS CHARGE

Accused of Blackmailing
Women of Disreputable Houses;
Were Getting Evidence.

Formal charges, accusing them of blackmailing women owners of alleged disreputable houses, were filed against Police Officers B. D. Hutchings and H. L. Coulter by Chief of Police Cox this morning. The charges terminate an investigation which has been in progress for about a month, it having been reported to Chief Cox that two officers had accepted money in return for releasing prisoners whom they had been sent to arrest. The formal accusations are made in a report by Captain George H. Bailey read as follows:

"On a number of occasions it has been necessary to send plain clothes officers to rooming houses where liquor was being sold and prostitution carried on. On or about May 18, 1910, Officer B. D. Hutchings and Officer H. L. Coulter were sent to the Plaza Hotel, 207 1/2 Third street, and reported that they were unable to make an arrest. Information came to me several days later that the two plain clothes officers had made an arrest in that house and had received \$150 in gold and released their prisoners.

Detectives Picked Out.
"A number of plain clothes men were lined up at the station and Officer B. D. Hutchings and Officer H. L. Coulter were picked out as the two men. Mrs. Wade, who runs the Plaza hotel, had gone on a business trip to Denver and did not return until about June 16, requested her and Axel Peterson to come to the office and in the presence of you and myself she testified that these were the ones that had been paid the \$150. Both officers denied receiving any money.

"Lottie Thomas, one of the girls arrested, stated that she had paid \$25 of the \$150 to Mrs. Wade. The following are the names of the houses to be subpoenaed: Louis Trummer, 325 Washington street, to bring notes and books of May 18, 1910; Mrs. Wade, 207 1/2 Third street; Axel Peterson, 207 1/2 Third street; Lottie Thomas, room No. 7, Abbott building, and Officer Portwood.

Admits Violation.
No denial is made by Mrs. Wade that she was not violating the law. After the arrests had been made she says she did not have the money in her possession at the time and that Peterson and Trummer, a Washington street saloon-keeper, Trummer still has the note in which she asked for the money and in which she stated its alleged purpose. Trummer also says that he made an entry on his books indicating the purpose of the loan. Peterson will testify that he went for the money.

Hutchings and Coulter are comparatively new men on the police force, having been in the service about a year. Following the orders of Chief Cox to close up rooming houses believed to be harboring disreputable women Hutchings and Coulter were detailed to the work because they were not generally known to the class of people involved. They secured evidence in a number of places. The officers admit that they were in the house mentioned, but vehemently deny that they accepted any money.

Chief Cox will present the charges to the police committee of the executive board without comment and an early trial will probably be given to the officers.

PROTEST AGAINST FRANCHISE GRANT

Property Owners Along Sev-
enth Street Frame Remon-
strance to U. R. Request.

A protest has been filed with the city council against the granting of a franchise to the United Railways company for laying wide gauge tracks on Seventh and Taylor streets. The remonstrance is signed by many prominent property holders whose property is on the line of the proposed track.

The franchise asked for by the United Railways company is on Taylor, from Front to Seventh streets, and on Seventh, from Taylor to Hoyt streets. The chief objection to the privilege is that the rental values of abutting property to the tracks would be greatly impaired, and there is no apparent need for a track on the said streets.

It is further urged by the protest that Seventh street has been recently improved, and to place a track there would necessitate a great expense to the property owners, as the heavy hauling over the proposed tracks would require a different kind of street surfacing material.

The persons back of the movement to not grant the franchise further contend that if such a track is laid, it would not be soon until heavy cars and trains would be running down the business part of the city, and that such would be a great injury to the city and to business interests.

It is taken to mean that a franchise granted would give the United Railways company, and the Hill interests, which control the company, a good chance of getting across the river on the new Broadway bridge, and also would give them a splendid chance to get a hold on the terminal yards.

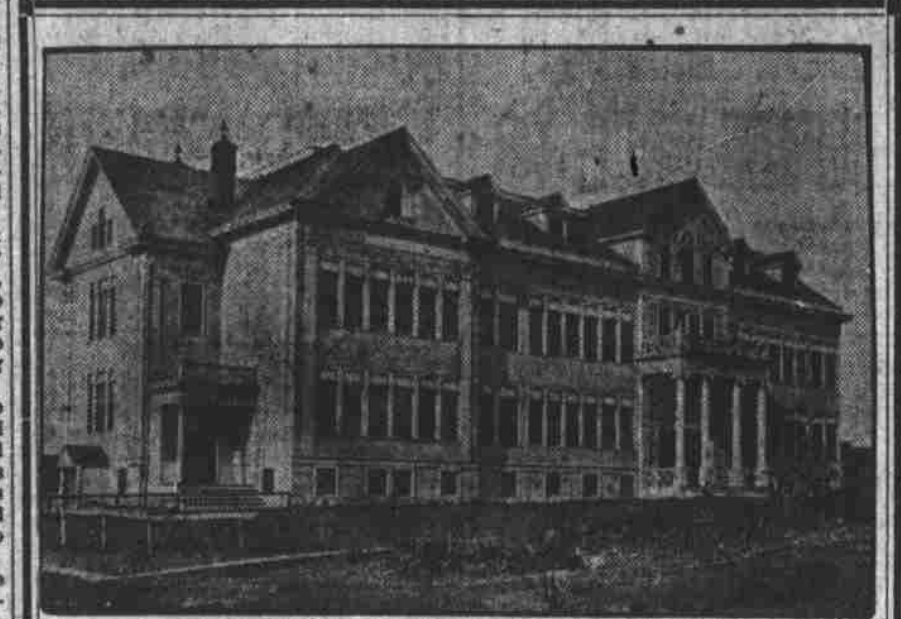

SENATOR McENERY, DEMOCRAT, DEAD

Civil War Veteran, and Senator
From Louisiana Since
March 4, 1897.

New Orleans, June 25.—United States Senator Samuel Douglas McEnery died here at 10 o'clock today. The cause of his death has not yet been made known. Senator McEnery was a native of Louisiana. He was born at Monroe, May 25, 1837. He was a veteran of the Civil war, serving as a lieutenant in the Confederate army. He served on the supreme bench of the state and had served in the United States senate since March 4, 1897, being among the oldest Democrats in the senate in point of service. Senator McEnery made a unique record during his final term in the senate. He gained publicity for his attitude during the consideration of the Payne-Aldrich tariff bill. Upon 36 roll calls while this bill was under consideration he was the lone Democrat to cast his vote with the Aldrich Republicans; upon 11 roll calls he was one of two Democrats to vote against his party majority, and on 33 roll calls he was absent.

Senator McEnery became ill Monday while en route from Washington to this city, but his ailment was not consid-

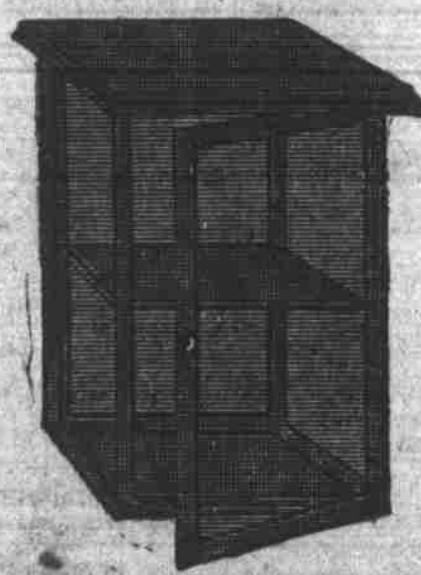
