Danger Signs Disappear

Danger notices placed on the Baker theatre building, which is being wrecked, were torn down yesterday.

The building inspector started an investigation this morning to ascertain who tore them away. A notice was posted over the entrance to the Grotto saloon, which is still open, and this was the first sign destroyed. Notices were also placed over the fruit stand and shining parlor, which are still in business. The theatre building has been wrecked and the remaining rooms, in which business is conducted, have been condemned by the building inspector. The council has instructed the city attorney to proceed with the condemnation proceedings to close out the other concerns doing business in the building.

Grocers Make Merry

One of the big features of the day was the baseball game between the retail grocers and city salesmen, which the latter won. Captain Spencer Complains

The police committee of the executive board has been asked by the owners of the steamer Charles E. Spencer to investigate a charge of favoritism alleged to have been shown by Harbormaster Speler and Harbor Patrolman Lillis. It is asserted by the captain of the boat that the harbor officials caused a warrant to be issued for the arrest of E. W. Spencer without any cause. The warrant was for exceeding the speed limit. Harbormaster Speler attaches little significance to the charge. He will present a large amount of evidence before the committee when the hearing is held.

New Morning Paper

Articles of incorporation have been filed with the county clerk by the Oregon Democratic Publication company. The incorporators are A. Goodwin Betts, F. J. Clark and C. P. Houston. The capital stock is placed at \$100,000, and will be issued in shares of \$1000. The articles set forth that the company proposes to do a general printing business, and to publish a morning daily to be known as the Oregon Daily Democrat.

To Dispatch Trains by Phone

Instead of the telegraph being used as on nearly all other roads in the country, the telephone will be employed almost exclusively. Poles and wires for the dispatching system have been ordered.
