Oakland, Aug. 11.—"If you are the George Samuels who owns Muldowney's tenderloin resort of low repute, then what have you to say for yourself?" Charging that Police Judge Samuels is assessed with the property on which stands the saloon where Jack London was one of the participants in an embroglio while on his way to the Jeffries-Johnson fight, the pugnacious author has jumped into the arena again with another open letter. In it he asks the question quoted above and indulges in other sarcastic comment.

The police magistrate to whom the missive is addressed admits that he is the owner of the property on which Muldowney's establishment stands. But he denies that he is the owner of or is interested in the resort itself, asserting that he leased the property several years ago and the building was put up and rented by other persons.

his chief. "And let me give positive assurance that the secretary is not responsible for any failure to apportion funds for Oregon reclamation projects as generously as to other states. The board of army engineers inspects all the projects, then makes its recommendations, and by these recommendations the president is governed, and by the president the secretary is governed."

Water Users Complain.

"Mr. Ballinger will visit the Klamath reclamation project when he leaves Portland on 6 o'clock tomorrow evening," continued Mr. Finney. "The water users down there have been making a lot of complaints, to this effect, that Director Newell had promised them a price of from \$18 to \$20 an acre, and now they have to pay \$30 an acre. The secretary wishes to learn why Mr. Newell did not keep his promises and what are the merits of the trouble."

Mr. Fisher said for Secretary Ballinger that the government has not abandoned the west extension to the Umatilla reclamation project, but that its feasibility is now being considered by a board of army engineers who will report within the next few weeks. Mr. Finney answered a question as to Roosevelt's supposed attitude toward the administration and its controversy with conservationists by saying: "There is a recent theory that Roosevelt is loyal to his good friends Pinchot and Garfield. So he receives them all alike, meanwhile secretly planning for the things that are later to develop, whatever these things may be."

"Of course my opinions in these matters would be of small value, anyway," Mr. Finney hastily added.

To Visit Crater Lake.

The secretary of the interior will also make a visit to Crater Lake National Park, so that he may determine if the project is worthy of additional government aid. The last apportionment was but \$5000, said the assistant. Nevertheless the secretary is always in favor of national parks, wherever they can be made feasible. Then he goes on to San Francisco which is the home of Senator Frank P. Flint, who is said to be slated to occupy the honored job of secretary of the interior, when Mr. Ballinger shall have been deposed or decapitated.

"Mr. Ballinger has never spoken of Senator Flint," said Mr. Finney. "I personally know him well and like him. He is a good friend. But from the secretary's viewpoint the candidacy of Mr. Flint for the place is empty foolishness, because, first of all, the secretary is going to go right on holding that position himself."

To Be Entertained.

Secretary Ballinger, Mrs. Ballinger, Mr. Finney, and the secretary's private secretary, H. F. McCabe, are all guests at the Imperial hotel. The secretary's entertainment in the city will be partially taken care of by H. H. Schwartz, a personal friend.

He will be the guest of the Commercial club at luncheon tomorrow and will speak at 1:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in the green room of the club to the public. His topics, as before said, will be conservation and reclamation and possibly the Oregon chance to get a proportionate slice of government re-

clamation appropriations, which slice has so far not been forthcoming. It is said that Representative Hawley will accompany the secretary to the Klamath reclamation project.
