Twelve young men, under the leadership of Mr. James L. Houghtsling, banded themselves together to work and pray for the extension of the kingdom. It was only three weeks ago that Mr. Houghtsling died. In the 27 years intervening Mr. Hough-taling saw this movement grow until filled the whole Episcopal church nd thence spread into Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Great Britain, outh Africa and in fact to all parts of nd Anglican communion. The brother-ood in the United States has grown such proportions that large offices uated in Boston are necessary for general administration and several retaries are constantly traveling m place to place to superintend the rk which individual chapters are do-National organizations of the brothheod exist in Canada, England, Scot-nd, Japan and the West Indies, and a movement is ever growing. 


