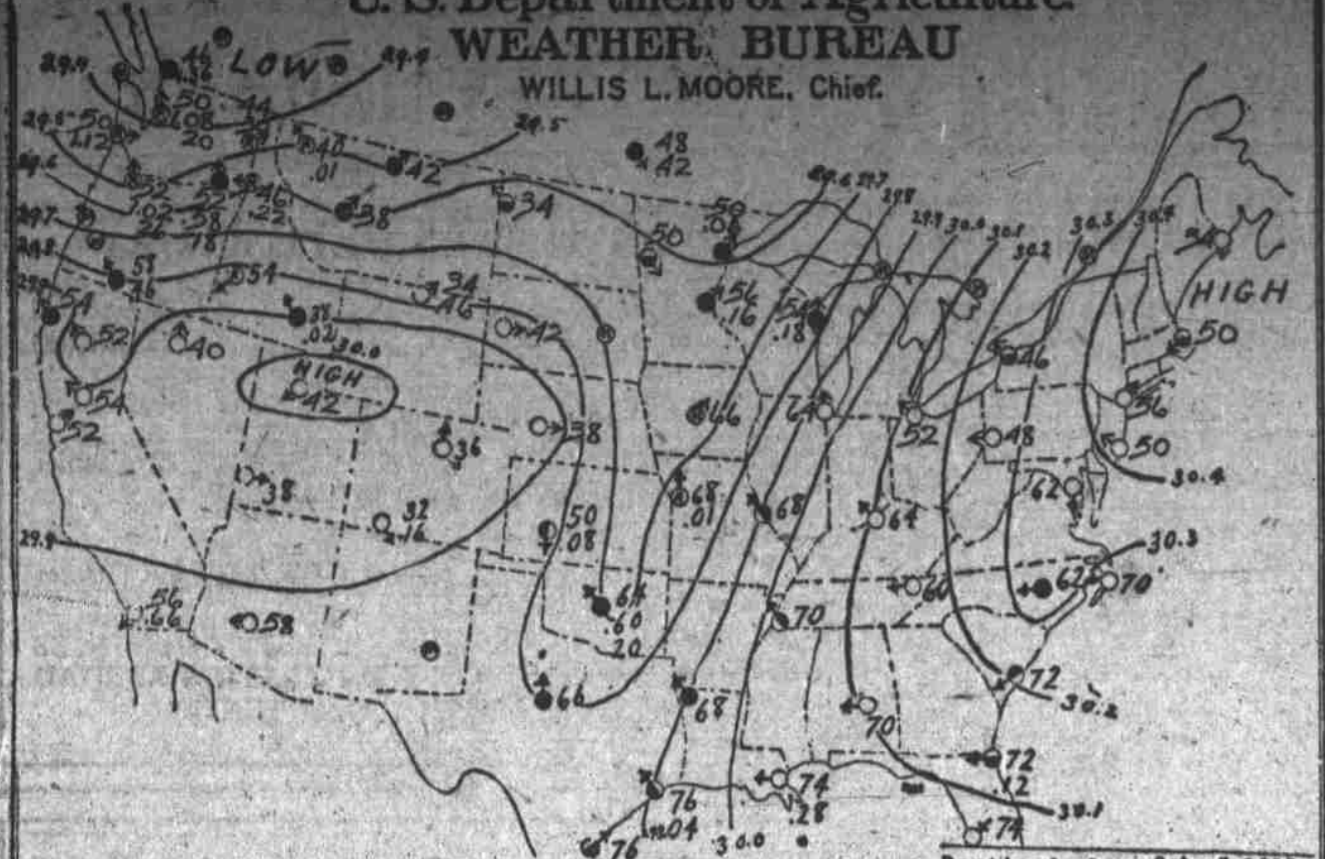

BULLET IN HEAD; GOES TO COURT

Victim of Pistol Duel Leaves Hospital Cot to Sign Complaint Against Assailant. With the bullet fired by George Currey, a taxidermy, in a pistol duel on Sixth street Saturday night, still in his head, E. C. Roberts, a saloonkeeper, was taken from St. Vincent's hospital to police headquarters this morning to sign a complaint against Currey.

David Dunning, a friend of Currey, had drawn a revolver in my saloon and I took it away from him," says Roberts in explaining the shooting. "I was talking Dunning to an officer when Currey came up to us at Sixth and Flanders street and ordered me to release Dunning. I refused and he drew his revolver and fired twice, one shot striking me. I replied with two shots, one of which hit Currey in the arm."

WIND BLOWS 35 MILES AN HOUR

However, Little Damage Is Reported; Reached Velocity of 72 Miles at North Head. A maximum of only 35 miles an hour was reached by the wind storm which accompanied the rain, its howling and the lashing of the rain on windows, gave people the impression that its force was much stronger than it really was, and so far as could be learned this morning no damage was done.

It started to blow about noon yesterday and gradually increased last night until it reached a maximum velocity of 35 miles from the south at 8:25 o'clock this morning. The blow being the hardest between 3 and 4 o'clock. This is the first of the storms from the south and since the rain began on Friday there has been 1.44 inches of precipitation, or .94 inches fell up to midnight of September 28.

On the Oregon coast the gale assumed greater proportions. The maximum velocity of the wind reported from North Head was 72 miles on two occasions, once before 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon when it was blowing from the southwest, and again during the night from the south. At 6 o'clock last evening the weather bureau report from North Head fixed the velocity of the gale at 60 miles from the south, which he thought the wind would increase tonight, but would be mostly over tomorrow.

Storm warnings were ordered out on the Straits of Fuca yesterday, but the highest velocity reported from Tacoma was 32 miles. Warnings are still being displayed at North Head. A good stiff breeze is now blowing off the coast. Forecaster Drake said this morning that the river will continue to rise for the next few days. The present stage of the water at Portland is 4.0 feet above zero.
