

GIRL MISSING; WOMAN HELD

Police Believe Mrs. Gertrude Blake Can Explain Disappearance.

Suspected of knowing facts which would clear up the disappearance of Isabel Harlow, aged 17, Mrs. Gertrude Blake, 23 years old, was arrested last night at the Cornelius hotel by Plain Clothesmen Montgomery and Shaffer and is held at the city jail under bonds of \$1000. Isabel Snyder, 17 years old, chum of the missing girl, was living at the hotel with Mrs. Blake, and was turned over to the custody of Mrs. Lola G. Baldwin, of the department of public safety for women, pending an investigation.

Mrs. Blake formerly lived at 574 Main street, where she employed the Harlow girl to assist her in the housework. Last week the woman called the girl's mother by telephone and asked permission to take her daughter, with her to San Francisco. She said she would pay all of the girl's expenses. Mrs. Harlow flatly refused her permission and, calling Isabel to the telephone, told her to come home.

The girl vanished Sunday, and no word from her has been received since. Yesterday a man who refused to give his name called Mrs. Harlow by telephone and told her that he thought her daughter was in The Dalles.

Mrs. Blake gave up the Main street house Sunday and moved to the Cornelia, taking the Snyder girl with her. The latter says Mrs. Blake had induced her to go to San Francisco with her, and they planned to start Saturday. The father of the Snyder girl interfered and brought about the arrest of Mrs. Blake.

"Did the little girl tell" was the first remark made by Mrs. Blake when she was placed under arrest last night. After that she became reticent and would not discuss the matter. The woman wore a number of valuable diamonds and had costly furs in her room, but would not tell the source of her income.

Mrs. Baldwin has discovered that the woman has used five aliases while living in Portland and is endeavoring to learn the reason. When Mrs. Blake was arraigned in municipal court today, at her request the case went over until Monday.

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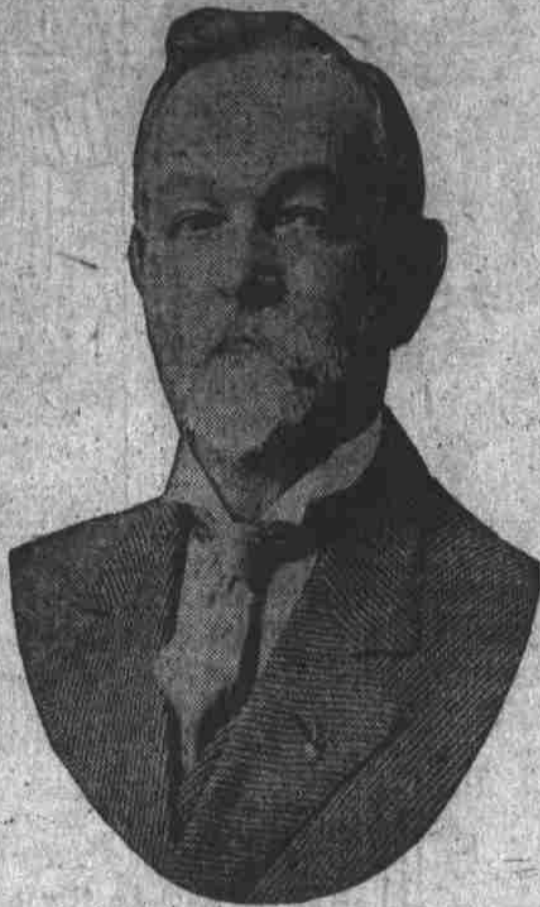
