

PROTEST AGAINST PROPOSED COUNTY

Citizens of Vale Show Reasons Why County of Otis Should Not Be Carved Out.

(Special Dispatch to the Journal.)
Vale, Or., Oct. 21.—At the largest meeting of the citizens of Vale and vicinity Tuesday evening held in the Chamber of Commerce, that body passed unanimously resolutions against the creation of proposed Otis county, which is to be taken out of Malheur, Harney and Grant counties. The resolutions were passed on account of the intense feeling now all over the territory to be affected, 96 per cent of the taxpayers in the proposed boundaries opposing the creation for the following reasons:

That the new county will have to assume part of the indebtedness of the counties from whose territory it is to be taken; that a court house and jail will have to be erected; that salaries will have to be paid; that a year will have to elapse before a tax can be levied and collected; that the county will be in debt at least \$100,000 within the first year; that every bill will have to be paid out in warrants with no prospect of such warrants being paid for in 15 or 20 years, which will cause the new county to pay a premium of 40 per cent on everything purchased; that the village of Drewsey, which aspires to become a county seat will be 18 miles from the proposed railroad and that in all probability a county seat fight would result in a few years; that the territory to be taken is composed of large farms, whose owners are all opposed to the creation and that there can be little future development because practically all the land susceptible of cultivation is now in private ownership of cattle and sheepmen.

The resolutions adopted by the Vale Chamber of Commerce, almost similar to those adopted by the commercial bodies of Ontario, Nyssa, Juntura, Beulah and Riverside, state:

"Whereas, All the taxpayers of Malheur county residing in the district proposed to be cut off into Otis county are opposed to such action for the reason that there is not sufficient taxable property in said Otis county to maintain a county government; therefore be it

"Resolved, That we deplore the action of the residents of Drewsey, Oregon, in seeking to initiate a bill for the establishment of Otis county, and request that the electors of the state vote against said measure."

Trafalgar Day in London.

London, Oct. 21.—Trafalgar day, the anniversary of the great naval battle in which Lord Nelson met his death, was observed in London and elsewhere throughout the United Kingdom today, in accordance with the custom of many years. Many banquets and public meetings were held under the auspices of the Navy league and other patriotic organizations. During the day thousands of persons stopped to admire the handsome floral tributes placed about the base of the Nelson column in Trafalgar Square.

ABERDEEN DENIES CENSUS FRAUDS

Business Men Offer to Stand Expense of Recount; Ask Judgment Withheld.

Aberdeen, Or., Oct. 21.—Census frauds in this city are emphatically denied, and a recount has been asked by the chamber of commerce. The chamber also makes a formal protest to Secretary Nagel against the charges, and the city has offered to pay the expenses of another enumeration.

The following telegram, signed by 50 of the most prominent business men of the city, was sent to Secretary Nagel:

"Believing that there is no basis for the statements, as reported in press dispatches, that gross frauds have been committed in the enumeration of Aberdeen's population, and believing that such reports do this city a great injustice, the Aberdeen chamber of commerce respectfully urges that you order a recount of the population of this city, the expense of such recount to be borne by the city itself.

"We ask that this recount be made under your supervision. We most respectfully request further that your office permit us to furnish sworn statements as to the methods employed in the late enumeration by other than regularly authorized census agents and that you withhold judgment and a statement of the count here until further information is in your hands. Letter will follow."

The letter will cover all the alleged fraudulent work raised by the census director.
