

MANNING MAKES VOTES IN CROOK

Visits Prineville Fair; Voters Think Lafferty Not Qualified for Office.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Prineville, Or., Oct. 21.—John Manning, Democratic candidate for congress from the Second district, spent a part of Tuesday and Wednesday in this city. Mr. Manning visited the Central Oregon fair and congratulated the people upon the splendid showing of development in the products of the farm. The town was full of people from all over central Oregon and Mr. Manning met all of them. For several hours he held a reception in the lobby of the Hotel Prineville. Mr. Manning was much encouraged with the numerous pledges of support given him by Republicans and upon leaving was told that he would carry the county.

Sentiment on the congressional fight in this section of the state is steadily crystallizing in Manning's favor, for the feeling is growing that in view of the fact that A. W. Lafferty, Mr. Manning's opponent, has been a resident of the state less than five years, a part of which time he was a roving detective under orders from the interior department, he has not yet acquired that degree of standing among the people and familiarity with conditions entitling him to election to so high an office as representative in congress. Expressions of opinion to this effect are to be heard constantly throughout this part of the state.

Mr. Manning left here for Shaniko Wednesday afternoon and will from there proceed to other points farther east.

WASHINGTON DRUGGISTS MUST PAY LICENSE

This is the decision of the supreme court in passing upon the test cases that have been vigorously pressed by the State Druggists' association.

This, however, is emphatically denied by the editor in the first issue, who announces the paper is a permanent institution of the city. The paper at present consists of four pages and has no telegraph service.

CAPTAIN STRUVE SUED FOR DIVORCE; DESERTION

(United Press Leased Wire.) Seattle, Oct. 21.—Mrs. Florence Struva, a member of one of California's

most prominent families, has filed suit for divorce against Captain Harry K. Struve, whom she married at Manila nine years ago. The complaint charges that the husband deserted Mrs. Struva at San Francisco on December 6, 1905, and refused to live with her again. On several occasions, it is charged, Captain Struve refused to receive or allow her to see him.

Captain Struve yesterday filed his answer, admitting the marriage, but denying the allegation of desertion, and asking that the action be dismissed.

Aged Minister Wants Divorce. (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Eugene, Or., Oct. 21.—Rev. Crawford Dobson, an aged minister of Eugene, has begun suit against his wife, formerly Mrs. Alwilda Hayden, whom he married on the 10th day of May, this year, on the ground of cruel and inhu-

man treatment. He alleges that she refuses to live in the same part of the house with him and that she treats him in a contemptuous and discourteous manner. She often demanded to know why he did not take his things and leave, he alleges, and finally her conduct became so unbearable, according to his story, that he was compelled to separate from her.

Death of Malheur Pioneer. (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Ontario, Or., Oct. 21.—The funeral of J. E. Madden, one of Malheur county's well known pioneers, who died suddenly of heart disease in the depot at Spokane last week while en route home with his wife from a visit to their daughter near Seattle, took place Wednesday from the Methodist church and was largely attended. The services were conducted by Rev. J. E. Miller and the interment was in the Ontario cemetery.

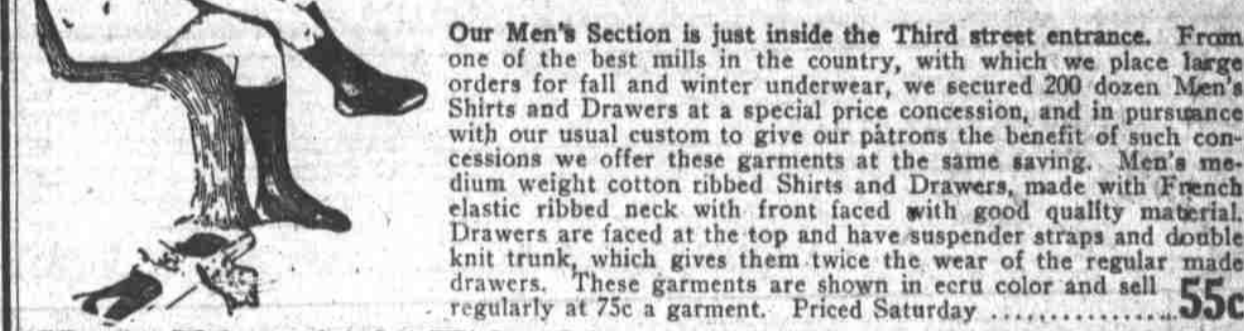
