

DIG ORCHARD DEAL NEAR ROSEBURG
 New Corporation to Plant 750 Acres With Walnuts, Apples and Pears.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
 Roseburg, Or., Nov. 17.—An important deal of orchard land near this city was completed Tuesday, when the E. C. Allen farm of 750 acres, which is situated on the west side of the Southern Pacific railroad, just beyond the Edgewater postoffice and extends to within one mile of Roseburg, was sold to a company of Illinois capitalists. The transfer was negotiated by the local real estate firm of Himes & Oliver, who have also acquired an interest in the new company.
 The new owners have incorporated under the name of the Edenbower Orchard land company, with a capital of \$100,000. The principal stockholders consist of seven Illinois men and the two local real estate men who will act as sales managers for the company, with offices in Roseburg and eastern cities.
 The tract has already been platted into five 10 and 20 acre tracts.
 Numerous roads and streets have been laid out throughout the tract and several of them will be bordered with English walnut trees, making about four miles of walnut drives. The tracts will be planted mainly to choice varieties of apples and pears, with occasional walnut groves.
 This is one of the most advantageously situated tracts in this vicinity, where homes can be developed with practically every city convenience. The city water and electric light and power mains supplying this city from Winchester extend along the side of the entire tract, giving special advantages in that respect. The Edgewater station and postoffice almost at the very edge of the tract gives ample railway conveniences also. Under the management of this new company this tract promises to soon become one of the most popular and attractive suburban districts near this city.

TOLSTOY YET LIVES AND MAY RECOVER

(United Press Special Wire.)
 St. Petersburg, Nov. 17.—Count Leo Tolstoy still lives, despite reports of his death that threw a pall over Russia late yesterday. Advice to that effect from authoritative sources were received today and draperies that were hung on public doors were hastily taken down.
 In the laborer's hut at Antapova, which has been Tolstoy's sick room since his breakdown at Antapova station, the count passed a restless night according to the dispatches that reached here early today. Later advice said his temperature had receded to 100, and that there were hopes that he might recover.
 The first dispatches telling of Tolstoy's death were received from Prince Obiinsky and were generally credited. Theaters closed their doors, entertainments were cancelled, and messages of condolence from all sides were sent to Countess Tolstoy.
 Messages that followed that of the prince said that Tolstoy in his dying moments had refused a reconciliation with his wife and that she was barred from the death chamber. These messages brought expressions of grief from even the enemies of Tolstoy.
